

63rd Annual Drake Relays

Jim Ryun Fades on 25th Birthday

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP) — Comeback-trying Jim Ryun celebrated his 25th birthday Saturday by fading to a next to last place finish in an Olympic year special mile, while the world distance medley record and meet marks fell steadily in the 63rd annual Drake Relays.

BOULDER, Colo. (AP) — Colorado's Buffaloes completed their final spring football scrimmage here Saturday, with quarterback Clyde Crutcher leading the number 1 offense to two touchdowns and the number three offense to another in the two-hour session.

Crutcher, a 5-foot-11, 170-pounder from Okmulgee, Okla., hit 18 of 29 passes for 159 yards, including a 13 yard scoring toss to tight end J. V. Cain. The Houston, Tex., junior caught a total of six passes for 54 yards.

In the rushing department sophomore Ron Engle led with 77 yards in seven carries, followed by tailback Charlie Davis' 90 yards in nine carries.

Next Saturday the varsity will meet an alumni team for their annual battle.

Ryun, who last week ran his 20th sub-four minute outdoor mile at the Kansas Relays with 3:57.1, entered the eight-runner special mile despite a week of intestinal disorder.

Ryun, world mile and half-mile record holder, was charged up to the extent of causing a false start. But after pressing for the lead entering the second quarter mile lap, he dropped far back and finished seventh with 4:09.0.

The event winner and Drake record breaker was Bob Maplestone of Eastern Washington State College, a student from Cardiff, Wales, in 4:00.4. Maplestone, who repulsed a run at him early by Ryun, led most of the way in breaking the meet's special mile record of 4:01.0 set in 1964 by Tom O'Hara of Chicago Loyola.

Kansas State's well balanced quartet of Clardy Vinson, running the 880 leg; Mike Lee, handling the 440; Rich Hitchcock turning the three-quarter mile and Howe, broke the former world and national record 9:33.0 set by Kansas in 1969 when the Jayhawks were anchored by Ryun, then at his peak.

The 20-event closing program produced a double champion in Fred DeBernardi of Texas-El Paso, who Saturday added the Drake shot put title to the discus crown he won Friday.

World record holder Ron Milburn of Southern University easily retained his 120-yard high hurdle title with a 13.8 clocking, a tenth of a second off the Drake record of 13.5 he set last year.

Other repeating champions included Jacques Accrabray, NCAA champion from Kent State, who retained the hammer throw title with a loss of 213.7, bettering the Drake record by almost eight feet, and distance star Frank Shorter of the Florida Track Club, who won the six-mile run by a shade over club runningmate Jack Bachelier.

In the special women's mile

run, Teri Anderson of Topeka, Kan., clipped more than 13 seconds off the Drake record with a 4:41.6 victory.
