# Ann Arbor Pioneer Wins, NW Next in Mott Relays

If Ann Arbor Pioneer can translate its relays strength into a regular track meet, it should be ranked a worthy title contender when the Class A state track meet comes to Houston Stadium on May 20.

Pioneer made a shambles of the fourth annual C. S. Mott Relays Saturday at Houston, piling up a record 91 points to run away from a 25-team field which included several teams who've done well in recent state meets.

NORTHWESTERN was second with 65 points, a total which exceeded the record of 56, and defending champion Kearsley ranked third with 50.

Southwestern was ninth, Northern 10th, Carman 11th and Central tied for 12th with Grand Blanc. Beecher, Powers and Swartz Creek also got on the scoreboard but Clio and Flushing didn't.

Pioneer won the four-mile, shot put, distance medley, mile and shuttle hurdles relays and was second in the two-mile and triple jump. It

also won one and took a second in individual events.

NORTHWESTERN was best of the area teams, winning the high jump and C. S. Mott (half-mile) relays and Brian Coles taking the individual high hurdles.

Kearsley won the eight-mile relay, run cross-country style, and the pole vault.

Carman's sprint medley team took that school's first Mott triumph.

## Pack Signs Two, Three Still Out

GREEN BAY, Wis. (AP) — Offensive tackle Dick Himes and running back Perry Williams signed with the Green Bay Packers but three other members of the National Football League club will become free agents unless they sign by midnight today.

Himes, a four-year veteran, signed for 1971 through 1973. Williams, a two-year man and a backup runner, agreed to terms for 1971 and 1972.

Still unsigned for 1971 are linebacker Ray Nitschke, quarterback Bart Starr and running back MacArthur Lane.

Other victories went to Lansing Sexton (two) Oak Park (three) and Ann Arbor Huron (one).

THREE RELAY records were broken and another tied. Three individual marks were shattered and two equaled.

Pioneer's Bob Elliott threw the shot put 57-9/4 and triple jumped 47-1 for individual records. Mike Rollins of Oak Park tied the 100-yard dash record of 10.0 seconds and Kearsley's Jim Stokes, a sophomore, tied the pole vault record of 13-6.

He and brother Dave combined for a 25-6 total which equaled the record by another Kearsley duo last year.

NORTHWESTERN'S Reggie Ferguson broke the meet

record with a 6-5 high jump and combined with Doug Gibbs' 6-4 to total 12-9 for another record.

Pioneer's four-mile relay team lowered the record to 18:16.7 and Oak Park's 440 relay quarter shaved the record to 43.7.

Kearsley's eight-mile unit had Joe Dixon, Bill Freeman, Dana Garchow and Dave Powell. Northwestern's Mott foursome had Steve Moten, Cornelius Wilson, Tim Davis and Don Mosley.

Dave Hartley, who owns the Flint area's best 880 time, ran the 440 leg on Carman's sprint medley with Brad Rainwater, Bill Weir and Kevin Skidmore for teammates.

## Gophers Recruit 6-foot-11 Texan

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (AP) — Minnesota basketball Coach Bill Musselman said the player he considered his No. 1 recruiting target—6-foot-11 Tommy Barker of Brownsville, Tex.—has signed a national letter of intent with the Gophers.

"I consider him to be one of the four best centers in the country in high school basketball last season," said Musselman, who coached the Gophers to the Big Ten championship in his first season. "I knew that over 100 schools were after him besides us and our entire coaching staff has worked on him."
