

Mt. Morris's Young Sets Three Regional 'B' Marks

CARO — Roy Young set three records in pacing Mt. Morris to the Class B Regional track championship Saturday.

The Panthers' versatile senior bettered existing marks in the 100 and 220-yard races and in the long jump.

Young was clocked in 9.7 seconds in the 100 and 22.2 in the 220. His winning long jump effort was 22-feet, five-inches.

MT. MORRIS qualified nine individuals into next Saturday's Class B meet and totaled 49½ points. Saginaw SS Peter and Paul was second with 39 points.

Also qualifying with Young were teammates on the 880-yard relay unit, Don Gamble, Karl Gunther and Tim Tucker. The Panthers' won the event with a time of 1:31.6.

Gunther also earned spots in the 440 and high jump, finishing second in both events. Gamble qualified with Young in the 100 with a third-place finish.

MT. MORRIS was second in the 440-yard relay. Running for the Panthers were Don and Ron Gamble, Gordon Carner and Shelton Pinnix.

Roger Hoeflinger of Mt. Morris was second in the pole vault and Gunther, Tucker, Rod Keys and Gary Coggins finished third in the mile relay.

Two other area teams, Montrose and Lakeville, scored 11 and two points, respectively.

Montrose earned nine points in the 120-yard high hurdles, with a second, third and fourth-place finishes. Eric Rush qualified for the state meet with a

time of 15.5 seconds and Bob Ranger qualified with 15.6

HOLY ROSARY qualified six runners in four events of the Class D meet also held at Caro.

The Wolverines totaled 19 points. Unionville won with 117.

Holy Rosary's mile relay team finished second in 3:47. Its members were Paul Martel, Mark Mangett, Larry Mansour and George Butts.

Mansour finished second in the mile, Roscoe Johnston was third in the two mile and Mark Ecker was third in the 139-yard low hurdles.
