





Two Joneses Win & Events

Reggie Named Outstanding Athlete of Korf Meet

News Staff Writer . One Jones added to another Jones would normally add up to two, right? Wrong!

One Reggie Jones and one Jim Jones add up to six. That's six first places—three each—in the third annual Saginaw News sponsored Herb Korf Saginaw County Invitational Track Meet held at Saginaw High Tuesday night.

It was a perfect night for running, warm temperature and no appreciable wind. But, there was only an estimated crowd of 500 on hand to witness the event.

Saginaw High's Reggie Jones, the state Class A champion in the 100 and 220, did his stuff in both events to carry home winning trophies. He tied Gary Peaphon's record in the 100 at 10.0 seconds and topped Peaphon's 220 mark of 22.4 with a mark of 22.2 seconds. The Trojans Jones also anchored

Saginaw High's record-setting win in the 880 relays. He and Larry Foster, Cal O'Neal and Mike Thomas turned in a 1:32.0 mark to wipe out Bridgeport's record of 1:33.5. For his efforts, Reggie Jones was named

the outstanding athlete of the meet by the Korf Games Committee. He had to beat out Arthur Hill's Jim Jones, who placed second in the balloting.

The Hillites' Jones also had quite a night for himself. He took the high jump and long jump in the field events and came back to win the 880 and anchor the Lumberjacks' third place finish in the mile relay.

Jones went 6-0 to win the high jump and 20-9 to take the long jump. Neither was a record, but good enough to top this season's county athletes. Jones also won the 880 at two minutes flat in a good race that saw him come from third to win on the


