## Webber Goes From Last to First Carter, Roberts Only CJH Double Track Winners

They came from dead last a year ago to claim their first City Junior Iligh track championship with a winning total of 58 points in the sixth running of the meet at Greg Johnson. Saginaw High's track Thursday.


Webber did not score a point in last year's meet and finished sixth. North won it last season, and Central won it the first four times around.

The defending champ North was second with 37 points, followed by Central with 29, South 28, Arthur Eddy 10 and Zilwaukee 5. Sprinter Reggie Carter led Webber to seven firsts as only one of two double winners in the meet. Carter won the 100 dash at 11.0 and wiped out one of Saginaw High's Reggie Jones' record in the 75 dash at 8.3. Jones had the mark at 8.4. .4. North's Gary Roberts was the other double winner with a sweep of the hurdle events. He took the 60 highs in 8.7 seconds and set a record in the 100 lows at 12.4. The hold record was 12.5 by North's Dean-Luplow. The only other record set was by Carlos DeLeon of Webber in the 880 run at 2:11.3. The old mark was 2:14.5 by George Wilson

of Central. Since the mile was a new event added to the slate this season Rick Trevino of Webber automatically establishes the record with his winning time of 5:04.9. Other Webber wins came from Ken Underwood in the long jump at 5-8 to tie the existing record owned by Curt Thon and

Webber's last win came in the 880 relay at 1:47.2 by Don Madden, Dwight Wood, Phil Law and Lewis Lee. Madden was third in the 60 dash and Law third in the low hurdles.

Other top performances for Webber were turned in by Underwood with a first in the long jump added to a fourth in the high jump, John Pearson with a first in the shot put and second in the high hurdles and Ruben Allaniz second in the low hurdles and fourth in the 60 dash. North won four events, and also did not enjoy the supremacy of the field events it did a year ago.



Tom Schoen won the pole vault for North at 9-11, Nolan Bryant won the 220 at 25.9, and Roberts won the hurdle events.

This year its Saginaw High track coach Claude Marsh's turn to gloat. It seems the top talent is headed for Saginaw High next fall. North fed Arthur Hill and John McCarger a year ago.


