

PSL TRACK BATTLE WIDE OPEN

Redford Boasts Brightest Star

The 50th annual Public School League track and field title is very much up for grabs, but the star of the show has already been determined. Redford High has only two

chances of winning the team title Friday at Central High: Slim and none. But in Clarence Chapman, its only qualifier, the Huskies have a winner.

On a cold and dank day Wednesday, Chapman — the state long jump champion—led the qualifiers into the finals with a leap of 23 feet 1 inch. He's already hit 32-11 this season and is a heavy favorite in the event.

BUT CHAPMAN'S talents

don't end at the long jump pit.

Wednesday, he tied Jim Smith of Murray-Wright for the best qualifying time in the 100-yard dash, 10 seconds flat, and then came back to lead the qualifiers in the 220 in 22.5 seconds.

With a bit of luck Friday, he could be a triple winner. Friday's action starts at 3:30 p.m.

It's virtually impossible to name a team champion in advance. Twenty-one of the 22 PSL schools qualified at least one contestant or relay team.

Mackenzie and Pershing have the best chance of unseating Northern as team champion. Coach Stan Mullin at Mackenzie qualified three relay teams and nine individuals. Pershing coach Allan Tellis will counter with three relays and seven individuals.

PERSHING might claim an edge due to the fact that both its mile and 880-yard relay teams posted the fastest quali-

fying teams of the day. Friday will also mark the
