Chapman Sets School Mark of 6-6 in High Jump

"Along with the Flint Northern win, this as to be our biggest victory of the eason," said Arthur Hill Coach John McCarger, whose team is now 7-1 in dual meets this season.

The meet was decided in the pole vault, the final event to finish. Arthur Hill led. 58-56, following the 440-yard relay, won by Saginaw High.

The Lumberjacks went into the pole vault without Jack Brechtelsbauer, who has cleared 13-feet this season, but is currently hampered with a pulled muscle. They needed to take at least second and third places in the event to win the meet, but came through with a clean sweep to capturé all three places

Jerry Wilson cleared 12-foot-6, his best vault ever, to win the event.
