Chicago has had its great track and field stars in recent years: the renowned University, of Chicago Track Club offered American record holder John Craft in the triple jump and NCAA pole vault record holder Jan Johnson on last summers U.S. team in the Pan-American Games.

Several months later the club put four on the U.S. team for the first indoor dual meet with the Russians. The national AAU champion Mayor Daley Youth Foundation women's team has landed Willye White and Mamie Rallins on most all touring U.S. squads including the Olympic team.

But the area has gone a long time without hosting a track and field meet of national

consequence. The meet today fills that void.

The young men you see competing here today will be battling for spots in the national Amateur Athletic Union Junior championships, to be held June 23-24 in Denver.

Only the top two finishers in this meet can go to the AAU Junior nationals, which decide the U.S. team for this summer's first international dual meet with the Russian Junior team.

Needless to say, the names of the athletes competing here today are worth remembering: they're sure to be our coming college stars and many have the potential to develop into future Olympians.

I like to look on this meet as another link on a chain of major track and field attrac-

tions held in the Chicago area.

Unfortunately, it's been eight years since the last link was added. That was in 1964, the farewell year of the old Daily News Relays. Not since then has a track and field meet of this stature been held here.

Digging back into history, the Daily News Relays emerged as an important stop on the indoor track circuit in 1936 with the spotlight on a legendary Kansas miler named Glenn Cunningham. The meet's swan song was highlighted by a world indoor mile record—which still stands—by Loyola's Tom O'Hara before a cheering 18,000 in the Chicago Stadium.

In between there were added attractions. In 1948, for instance, the Olympic trials were held at Northwestern and stars like Harrison Dillard and Mal Whitfield took a back-seat to a Northwestern hurdler named Bill Porter, who went on to win the Olympic championship.

Eleven years later a steeplechase victory by Chicago's Phil Coleman was one of the features of the Pan-American Games at Soldier Field. In 1961, the U.S.—Poland dual meet offered international competition at Stagg Field on the University of Chicago campus. In 1964 it was Northwestern as host for the Big Ten championships.

Now its 1972 and the International Prep Invitational. In the field are two national high school record-setters: Scott Overton of Ios Altos, Calif., in the discus and Alvin Jackson of Providence, R.I., in the hammer throw.

There's also a sprinter named Howard Jones from nearby Evanston. He is the best prep dashman ever produced in Illinois, the first man ever to win the 100 and 220, three straight years in the 78-year history of the Illinois prep championships.

Howard will face his toughest competition yet in the International Prep Invitational. Then there's Urbana's Doug Laz, son of the former Illinois pole vault world record holder Don Laz, and Ken Paulson of Elmhurst's York High. Neither was a state champion but they both recorded the best school boy performances in Illinois history in the specialties, Doug with a 15-foot 5-inch pole vault and Ken with a 21-second flat in the 220 yard dash.

And there's many, many more stars in the field. So lets sit back and watch some of

the world's best track and field athletes perform.
