

Cindergals Do Well In State Meet

The Cinder Gals, local girls track team affiliated with the AAU, took part in the state meet Saturday and several of the athletes came home with high places in the various events.

The meet was held at Northwood Institute in Midland with eight teams competing for team honors.

In the 9-and-under group, Robin Jones took third in the 220, long jump and 880, Nancy Brammer taking fourth in the latter event.

Three girls competed in the 10-11 year age group, Brenda Brammer placing third in the 880 with a new local time of 2:49, JoAnn Brammer was fourth in this event, Susan Hammond sixth, Joan Quick was fifth in the 100 and sixth in the 440 yard run.

Kim Morey set the pace in the 12-13 year group with three thirds in the 100, finishing behind the two fastest girls in this age group in United States, in the 220 with a new local time of 26.2 and in the long jump, 15 ft. 7 1/2 inches, also a new city record. Her time in the 100 was 11.7 seconds.

Kelly Thomas was third in the 800 in 2:33, a new city record, with Joey Wickstrand placing fourth in the 50 yard hurdles and fifth in the long jump. Ann Quick was sixth in the shot put.

Other girls with improved times, but not placing included Lynn Schroeder with a 2:36 time in the 880, Mary Kuhn with 2:49 in the latter event, and Barb Knudsen with a 68.3 time in the 440.

The local team will host a sanctioned girls AAU meet Saturday at Thirby Field with complete details made available later this week. The group is coached by Larry Grow.
