

Whitehall Wins Invitational

The Whitehall Vikings, in just their third year in the sport, captured the team title in the Sixth Annual Ludington Invitational cross country meet held last Saturday.

The Vikings came in with 86 points with the team of Palmatter, B. Jackson, T. Jackson, Quigley and Biogren. The Reed City Coyotes took second with 98 points. The Ludington Orioles placed third

with 104 points, then it was Holland West Ottawa 106, Muskegon Reeths-Puffer 114, Shelby 144, Fremont 151, Montague 152, Oakridge 171 and Hart 235.

Reed City's premier runner Herb Lindsay finished far ahead of the pack to take individual honors with a sensational 14 minute and 39 second time for the rugged three mile course. Lindsay is one of the top high school runners in the state and

also the nation with a flock of scholarships to choose from when he completes his fabulous four-year career at Reed City next spring.

In setting the new course record at Tinkham and Jebavy, "Hurrying" Herb ran the equivalent of three 4 minute and 33 second miles. When you consider for instance that Ludington's great Wally Shaffer holds the school record for one mile on a flat track of 4:32.7

while Lindsay ran an average of 4:33 for three miles over rough terrain you can see why major track schools throughout the nation are interested in this young man.

Second place went to Shelby's Edmond Flores in a school record time of 15:39. Palmatter and Bill Jackson of Whitehall finished third and fourth, Ludington's Bob Lewis came in fifth and set a new Oriole record of 16:10.

Fremont's Fran Lanciaux took sixth, Darrell White of Reeths-Puffer, seventh, Dave Veltman of Shelby, eighth, Dave Goin of Montague ninth and Tom Jackson of Whitehall was tenth. All of the first ten runners received medals.
