Four and a half months after viewing the Mansfield Mehock Relays last year, this writer sat in the Olympic Stadium in Munich and watched the world's greatest athletes compete.

We were struck by the thought of what a long way it is from prep school competition to world-class athletics. A long and torturous road awaits any young hopeful.

But here is where it all starts; here at the high school level in a hotly competitive meet, boasting the best in the mid-west. Here is where the love of competition is born and where they all learn the sting of defeat and the exultation of victory.

The winners will break some very respected records today. They cracked three last year and have smashed 53 meet marks since the Relays moved to Mehock Field 10 years ago. If the weather is right, six or seven could fall.

One thing is sure: The calibre of the boys competing is good enough to challenge any set of records. Year after year they prove it.

Through it all, keep one thing in mind: You may be watching some of these same athletes competing for the United States in Montreal in 1976.

RELAYS STANDARDS

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards. This idea was presented to over 100 coaches, representing participating schools. The following standards are a composite of their replies.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

A rotating Mansfield-Mehock Relays Trophy will be awarded the team compiling the most points. This is a 36-inch trophy.

A beautiful trophy will be awarded the team making the most points in the field events.

A beautiful trophy will be presented to the team making the most points in the track events. This does not include relays.

Trophies will be awarded the first ten teams in the scoring. These are 20 inch trophies.

A beautiful 20 inch trophy will be given the winner of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fourth place.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fifth place.

Sixth Place will receive no awards other than one team point.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS

For Coaches and Athletes

Additional bleachers are set up on north of field for athletes to relieve the congestion in the infield.

There is an area in the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field. Slag walks are installed so the mud should be no factor in case of rain.

Also the pole vault pit, in use for the finals, will be at the end of the field to make for better viewing. Port-A-Pits are installed for the high jump and Pole vault.

Scores for events will be announced over the Public Address System.
