Mt. Clemens wins regional title

Mt. Clemens, the favorite for the state high school Class A track championship, won the Grosse Pointe North regional title Saturday with 63 points.

Hurdler Bob Cornwell led Mt. Clemens, which won four events. *Run n' r u p* Grosse Pointe North won five events,

but couldn't match Mt. Clemens' depth and finished second with 51½ points. Detroit Kettering was third with 22 points.

The top three finishers in each regional event qualified for the state finals next Saturday at Michigan State University.

Cornwell, the state's top hurdler, won the 120-yard high in 14.7 seconds and the

100-yard low in 20.2. Mt. Clemens' other firsts were by Elliott Edwards in the 800 (1:57) and the mile relay.

Ken Delor was a double winner for North in the 220 (21.8 seconds) and the 440 (48.6). North's other winners were Ed Brennan in the mile (4:25.8), Tom Hammer in the two mile (8:33.7) and pole vaulter Dan Warner (12-5).

At Warren Fitzgerald

Pershing won three events to capture the Warren Fitzgerald regional with 25½ points. Fitzgerald was second with 21 points.

Pershing won the 550 relay (1:31.8), mile relay (3:22) and Tim Harris of Pershing won the 440-yard run in 50.6. Also qualifying from Pershing was Gary Milner, who finished third in both the 100 and long

jump. Detroit Northern's Jeff Dill, brother of Michigan State sprint star Marshall Dill, was

the only double winner. Dill won the 100 in 13.7 seconds and the 220 in 22.2.

At Farmington

Art Little and Randy Williams led Detroit Cooley to a first-place finish in the Farmington regional. Cooley scored 38 points. Redford Union and Southfield tied for second with 30 points and Bishop Berrigan had 27.
