GENERAL INFORMATION

(Contestants and Coaches)

1. **DRAWINGS**--Heat leaders are placed according to the records made in the Regional Meets. Drawing for lanes in the dashers, hurdles and distance races were made previous to the start of the meet.
2. **WEIGHT MEN**--Have your shot checked for weight and the shot put ring at the time of the event.
3. **TRAINING ROOM**--Trainers will be available in the stadium training room.
4. **Coaches and Contestants** must stay in the stands during the meet. Contestants must keep out of the fenced-in area unless actually competing. Contestants will be subject to disqualification if they do not follow instructions of officials in regard to this matter.
5. All Contestants in the running events are to report to the "BULL PEN" assembly area when their event is called. At this time the clerks will assign the men to their heats. (The "Bull Pen" is located north of the running track.)
6. **SPIKES**--All track and field event contestants must wear quarter-inch (short) spikes in their shoes. Officials will be checking on this.

PRIZES:

- (a) **TEAM TROPHIES** will be awarded to the first and second placing teams in the meet.
- (b) **INDIVIDUAL POINT WINNERS** will receive medals; in the case of ties, duplicate medals will be awarded.
- (c) Team trophies will be awarded to the first place team in the 880, Mile, and 440 relays.

In Memoriam

GUY V. HOUSTON

The state track meet today is being dedicated to Guy Virgil Houston, the only high school representative in the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame. That honor was mostly the result of his record as Northern High football coach and a fantastic 148-41-12 record for a .783 percentage. That included a dozen Saginaw Valley Conference championships, one every other year in a 24-season career.

Yet few realize that Houston also was a truly great all-around athlete himself, being All State in football and basketball at Grand Rapids Central High and a star later at Western Michigan University. Yet the dedication of today's state meet in honor of Houston is most appropriate because Houston's greatest performances as a star athlete and coach may well have been in track.

Twice he captained Grand Rapids Central's team and led it to the 1917 state championship. His 52-second quartermile that season wasn't his best, ranking behind a 51.6 second effort the previous year.

Few realize that Houston also became a track coach, leading Menominee to the Upper Peninsula championships three times in five seasons before coming to Flint as Northern High football coach. His leadership made Northern the home of many state prep championships and none pleased Houston more than the times the Vikings dominated the state in track.

The dedication of today's competition in memory of this great sports figure means even more than an appreciation of his all-around ability as an athlete and coach.

Houston's best sport may well have been track.

The stadium named in his honor today hosts a new era of track hopefuls. Houston would be extremely proud of the honor accorded him in the spirit of today's competition in the sport he liked so much.

STADIUM FACTS

As the name honors a life composed of a multitude of talents, so, too, the completed edifice is formed of many individual components. The grandstand, the locker and concession area, the press box, the all-weather lighted track and the many subsidiary features comprise the totality which we commit to use this evening.

STADIUM—Built to accommodate 5,000 spectators, the stadium is constructed of precast concrete with steel frame supporting structures. An outstanding feature will be the colored perma-glass seating (gold for the reserved center section and green for the four adjacent sections). They are almost maintenance-free. Similar to seating now in use at the University of Michigan Stadium, their excellence will be further enhanced by durable, laminated numbering. Every seat at Houston Stadium will be the "perfect" one because of the almost complete absence of obstructing utility poles and supporting beams.

LOCKER AND CONCESSION AREA—In addition to a permanent concession stand, this area includes electrically heated locker rooms with lavatories and showers for each team, training room, equipment room and coaches room for the home team. There are also lavatories for spectators, office and officials room, ticket facilities and an electrical equipment room. Special locker room features include chalkboards and telephone hook-ups to the press box and the stadium office. The building has lightweight painted block walls, exposed concrete roof deck and concrete floors.

PRESS BOX—Probably the most impressive feature of Houston Stadium is the spacious two-tiered press box constructed of insulated metal panels. It will accommodate 42 people. The upper tier, composed of five all-enclosed booths, has two radio areas, a booth for the game announcer and a spotting booth for both the visiting and the home team. The lower tier has working area for the press and for scouts. A roof area serves TV personnel and cameramen.

ALL-WEATHER TRACK—A one-inch layer of rubberized material (Reslite) has been applied to an asphalt base giving all nine lanes of track the smooth, inclined surfacing which provides quick drainage. The same surface has been applied to all field event approaches. Colorful and permanent lane markings provide a crowning touch. Unusual features include drainage and dual approaches for the pole vault and long-jump areas and a circular high jump area permitting flexibility in the placement of high jump stands.

LIGHTING—A quartz beam floodlighting system of approximately 256 fixtures mounted on six steel poles at the 70 and 100-foot levels result in one of the finest illuminated stadiums in the Midwest. Lighting has also been provided for the area beneath the grandstand.

SUBSIDIARY FEATURES—These include 8' fencing enclosing the football and track areas, a public address system with loudspeaker for both the playing area and the locker room and a professional-type electrical scoreboard.

TRACK AND FIELD FACTS

Relays

The 880 Yard Relay is to be run in accordance with the provisions of Rule 8, Section 3, of the 1972 Official Track and Field Rules Book, except that the first two 220 yard legs are to be run in lanes from staggered starts. The number three runner will receive the baton from the number two runner in the same lane in which the latter started; thereafter, "At each station each competitor shall line up in the same relative position as for his teammate who starts the race but there may be movement to a position better suited to meeting the passer of the baton. Each passer will keep a straight course to the exchange zone and the burden of responsibility for taking the position which corresponds to that to which the passer is entitled is on the receiver. This permits a team which has a distinct lead throughout the race to make all exchanges in the pole position."

The One Mile Relay is to be run in lanes from staggered starts around the first two turns. The first exchange is to be made in the same lane in which each team started; thereafter, lanes are to be disregarded and the baton exchange is to be made in accordance with the above quotation.

The 440 Yard Relay is to be run from a two turn staggered start and in lanes throughout the entire event.

Qualification Standards

Qualification from Lower Peninsula Regional Meets to Lower Peninsula Final Meets-- The first three places in each event in each class in each Regional Meet may enter the Lower Peninsula Final Meet in that event and class. This however, is qualified by the following:

Three will qualify, providing there are eight or more entries remaining after the pre-meet scratch meeting, in that event in that class.

If there are five, six, or seven entries remaining after the pre-meet scratch meeting, two will qualify.

If there are four or less entries remaining after the pre-meet scratch meeting, one will qualify.

In addition to the above number of qualifiers allowed, any contestant who in a Regional Meet final, equals or betters the best eighth place time, (tenth place time for relays) height, or distance which was made in an event during the past three years at a Lower Peninsula Final Meet shall qualify to the 1972 Lower Peninsula Final Meet in that event in that class. Qualifying distances in the long jump and shot put preliminary trials are to be considered in connection with the above.

No additional 440 Relay teams will enter the Meets this year since it is the first year for this event.

Limitations of Competition

1. A contestant shall not enter nor compete in more than four events, of which a maximum of three may be track events.
2. When a contestant runs any distance of 440 yards or more, up to and including a one mile maximum, and is in another track event, at least two track events shall intervene between the two in which he competes.
3. A relay race is considered one of the number of events which a contestant may enter. After the first man of a relay team starts a race, he and the other members of the team are charged with participation in that event even though he or they may not actually have run any or all of their full distances in it.
4. Participation in a preliminary heat counts as competition in an event.
5. A contestant who participates in the 880 yard or one mile run shall not be allowed to participate in any other track event in which he runs 880 yards or more.
6. A contestant who participates in a two mile run shall not be allowed to participate in any other track event.
