and qualifying times in nine of the 15 events are better than existing records.

Saginaw High's Reggie Jones, who was named the meet's outstanding athlete as a junior last year, will return to defend his 100 and 220 titles. He is also the record holder in both events and has better times this season than those standards.

Jones also runs in the Trojans' 880 relay crew, which has the best qualifying time in that event as well as the 440 relay. Other Trojans in the top qualifying spots for this year's meet are Brian Bailey in the pole

vault, Bob Chapman in the high jump and Willie Dawkins in the 180 low hurdles.

Other winners from last year returning are Mike Arnold of Bridgeport in the 440 and Eisenhower's Kevin Taylor in the two mile. Both will be hard pressed to repeat since they lost to White Pine Conference foes in the league meet last Tuesday.

The qualifying times that are better than existing records are in the long jump, high jump, 440, mile, two mile, 880 relay and 440 relay in addition to the 100 and 220.

Jones will have a strong field on competitors to contend with in trying to repeat as the meet's most outstanding athlete.

Those with good chances of unseating Jones include Arthur Hill's Curt Thon, MacArthur's Bill Yeo, and Saginaw High's Bob Chapman. Others with outside chances are Hemlock's Paul Gorney, Frankenmuth's Dave Bannerman, St. Stephen's Pat Moore and Freeland's Dennis Sova.

Past winners were Ken McKinnon of Saginaw High in the inaugural meet in 1970, and Gary Penphon of Bridgeport in the 1971 affair.

Bill Stoner, who logged 42 years of teaching and coaching at Central Junior High, will be this year's honorary referee. He coached every sport the school offered during his tenure at the school and produced many outstanding athletes that went on to successful high school, college and pro careers.

Mrs. Beth Korf, always the most honored guest of the event, will once again be on hand to witness the event that pays special tribute to a very special person in the late Herb Korf.

Coaches who wish to submit an entry to be considered for the Korf Scholarship Award should contact by letter Ken Gray at Bridgeport High School. He will screen the applicants for the scholarship committee. If one of the applicants is deemed worthy of the award the announcement will be made at a future date.

Once again the people behind the scenes who do so much to make this meet a success should be acknowledged. A special tribute must be paid Claude Marsh, Ken Gray, Larry Laoding, Bob Parson and Hugh Matson.

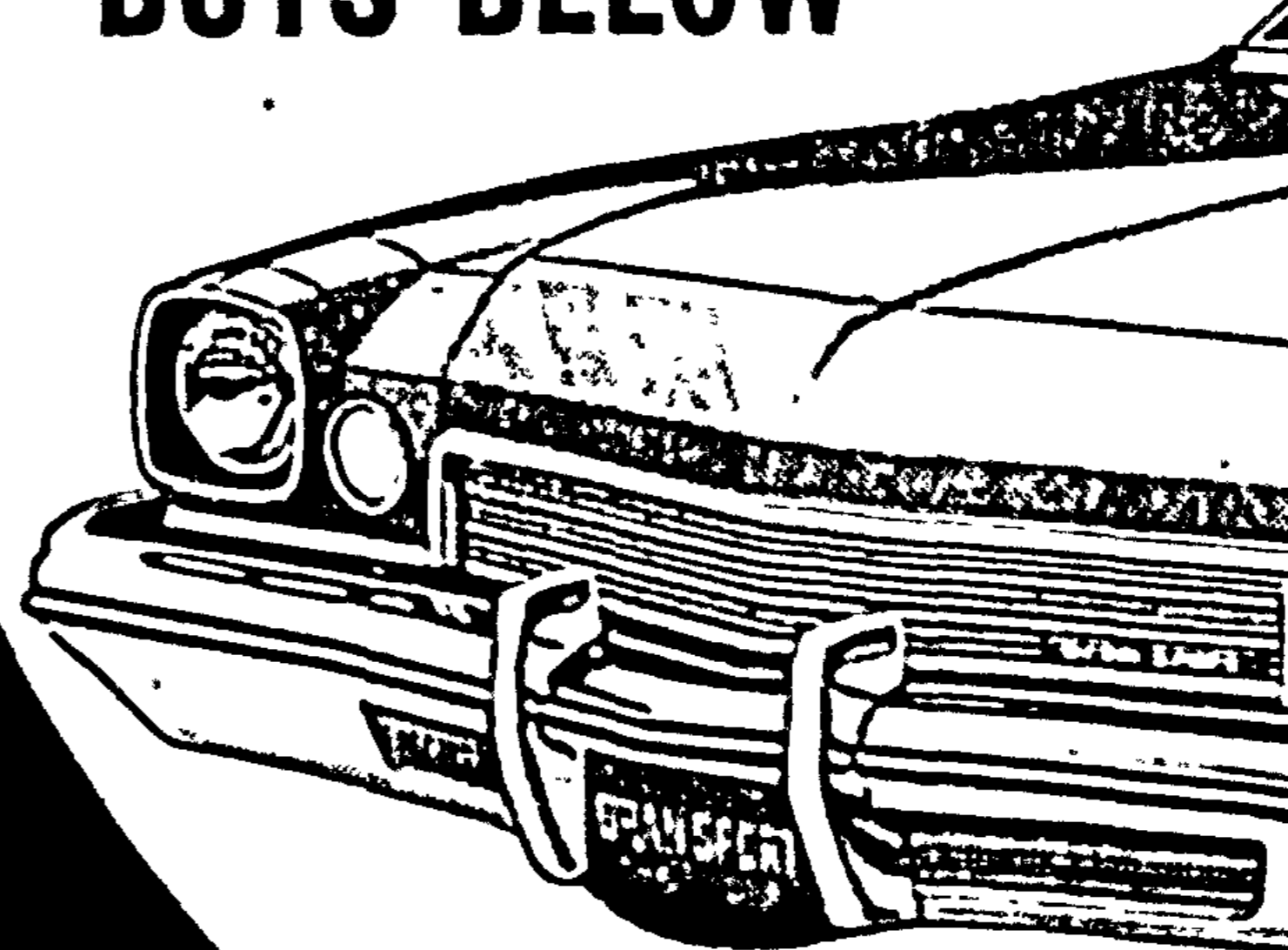
