Qualifying Marks Better Than Records

Korf Field Keeps Getting Stronger

It sounds like a broken record, but once again this year's Herb Korf Saginaw County Invitational Track Meet will field a better crop of athletes over-all than ever before.

The broken record means that once again a flock of records will be broken by Saginaw County's elite trackmen at Tuesday's fourth annual event, sponsored by The News, at Saginaw High's track.

Record holders in three events return

and qualifying times in nine of the 15 events are better than existing records.

Saginaw High's Reggie Jones, who was named the meet's outstanding athlete as a junior last year, will return to defend his 100 and 220 titles. He is also the record holder in both events and has better times this season than those standards.

Jones also runs in the Trojans' 880 rela crew, which has the best qualifying time in that event as well as the 440 relay. Other Trojans in the top qualifying spots for this year's meet are Brian Bailey in the pole

vault, Bob Chapman in the high jump and Willie Dawkins in the 180 low hurdles.

Other winners from last year returning are Mike Arnold of Bridgeport in the 440 and Eisenhower's Kevin Taylor in the two mile. Both will be hard pressed to repeat since they lost to White Pine Conference foes in the league meet last Tuesday.

The qualifying times that are better than existing records are in the long jump, high jump, 440, mile, two mile, 880 relay and 440 relay in addition to the 100 and 220.

Jones will have a strong field on competitors to contend with in trying to repeat as the meet's most outstanding athlete.

Those with good chances of unseating Jones include Arthur Hill's Curt Thon, MacArthur's Bill Yeo, and Saginaw High's chances are Hemlock's Paul Gorney, Frankenmuth's Dave Bannerman, St. Stephen's Pat Moore and Freeland's Dennis Sova.
