Track invitational brings out best among preps; three records tumble

Excellent all-around performances Wednesday night in the 1973 season finale had most Flint area track coaches rubbing their hands in anticipation of 1974.

Next year the season will end two weeks later. With the precarious Michigan spring weather, extending the season two weeks should create the best possible conditions for trackmen.

Considering the performances Wednesday in the Greater Flint Track and Field Invitational at Houston Stadium, the extra two weeks should create a mass assault on the record books.

EVEN DREARY weather-it was damp but wind was almost nonexistent-couldn't deter the Flint area's best.

Three records tumbled, at least 12 men had their best performances of the spring, there were two individual double winners and the meet produced its first champion from a Class C school.

That honor went to Mike Wilcox of Byron who came from behind in the last 220 yards to win the 880-yard run in 1:56.3. Among others, he defeated the Class B champion, Fenton's Dave Karns, and two men who placed in the Class A and Class B state meets.

WILCOX, the Class C champ, found himself in an unfamiliar situation. "It was the first time I've been behind in a race all season except for the first few yards," said the 5-foot-9 140-pound senior who didn't try track until he was a sophomore and didn't become a halfmiler until the 1972 regionals.

"You can't believe how much he's improved," said Coach Roger Bashore.

There were plenty of believers in the crowd which was limited to 458 because of precarious weather.

Wilcox's time was only 1.1 seconds off an excellent meet record of 1:55.2.

He was the only non-Class A winner.

NORTHWESTERN'S Brian Coles won both hurdles and Southwestern's Mark Carrington won both dashes.

Coles took the highs in 14.6 seconds and shaved two-tenths of a second from his 1972 meet record with a time of 19.8 in the lows. The slim senior barely outlasted Grand Blanc's Jeff Allen in the lows. Allen and third-place Don Toatley of Central also bettered Cole's meet record of 20.0.

For Coles, that made five victories in three years in the Greater Flint meet. He won highs and placed second in the lows as a sophomore and won both in

Carrington's times were 10.0 in the 100 and 22.1 in the lows. In the 220 he reversed last year's finish against Central's Duane Hill.

HILL HAD HIS inning in relays, joining Greg Davis, Charles Garrett and William Chatman in winning the 880 in 1:30.5 and the 440 in 43.3.

Carman's Brad Rainwater spurred a Metro League 'double' and claimed a record of 49.7 seconds in the 440 which

developed into the race of the night. Lapeer's Tom Utley (49.8) and Fenton's Scott Hofstetter (49.9) also bettered the meet record.

Minutes later Rainwater anchored Carman's victorious mile relay team to an excellent 3:25.5. His comrades were Kevin Skidmore, Gale Shaver and Bob

Northwestern, which won one-third of the 15 events, got another record performance from Dan Wilkerson who heaved the shot put 57-334, cracking the mark of 56-71/2. Teammates Terry Thames took the long jump at 21-1/2 and Jerry Stribling was only one-fourth of an inch below the meet mark with a high jump of 6-6.

KEARSLEY WAS next with three champions, Jim Stokes winning with a pole vault of 14-7, Greg Wilson taking the mile with a season best of 4:22.2 and Joe Dixon winning the two-mile run in .

Kearsley's Don Seibert, who was second in the mile and Grand Blanc's Craig Stone, who was third, had their best times of the year, only 2.5 seconds separating the top three.

The chief disappointment was 'the absence of most of the team from Linden, the area's top Class B club. Of 10 men who failed to appear, five were from Linden and the Eagles were unable to field any of three invited relay teams.


