

3 Schools Advance in PSL Track

Cooley, Kettering, Cass Tech and Northwestern took commanding positions in the Public School League divisional track and field championships Thursday, with 13 of 15 events completed.

The pole vault and high jump competition will be held on Saturday.

Cooley rolled up 126 points behind triple winner Randy Williams to take the lead in the Northwest Division, ahead of Ford (86), Mackenzie (75), Redford (41), Mumford (38) and Cody (29).

WILLIAMS raced to victories in the 120-yard high hurdles in 15.3 seconds, in the 180-yard low hurdles in 20 seconds and in the 220-yard dash in 22.8 seconds. Cooley also had the winning 880-yard relay team.

Joe Boyd was a double winner for Kettering in the Northeast division. Kettering finished the day with 118 points, compared to 107 for Pershing, 85 for Finney, 47 for Osborn and 41 for Denby.

Boyd captured the low hurdles in 19.9 seconds and the high hurdles in 15.4 seconds. Charles Carroll won the 100-yard dash in 10 seconds flat and Kettering also had winners in the 440-yard relay and the 880-yard relay.

Northwestern picked up first place finished in the 220-yard dash, the two-mile run and the 180-yard low hurdles on the way to 116 points in the Southwest Division. Central had 76, Chadsey 72, Southwestern and Western 44 each and Murray-Wright 25.

In the Southeast Division, Cass Tech piled up 118 points to 103 for Northern and Martin Luther King with 101. Southeastern and Northeastern trail with 49 and 24, respectively.

Jeffrey Dill was the lone double winner, winning both dashes for Northern, while Ozell Sterling of Southeastern turned in a 21-foot, 9-inch long jump.
