

N'western, Pershing Capture Track Titles

Northwestern on the West Side and Pershing on the East Side won Public School League track and field titles Thursday.

Northwestern, winning Its first West Side title since 1966, rolled up 84 points to 75 for second-place Cooley. Mackenzie and Henry Ford tied for third with 55, Central had 52 and Chadsey 39.

Northwestern won the 880yard relay and mile and then put the title away in the twomile finishing 1-2-4. Lawrence Bell won the event in 10 minutes and 17 seconds with Ronald Fleming finishing second and Dale Chatey fourth.

Randy Williams of Cooley won both the 120-yard high hurdles and 180-yard lows while Larry Stokes of Central turned in a sharp 49.3-second quartermile and James Thomas of Mackenzie captured the 880 in 1:56.8.

PERSHING ALSO won only three events, but piled up 97 points for East Side honors. Kettering was second with 82½ followed by Northern (60), Finney (59), Cass Tech (48) and Martin Luther King (39.)

Pershing got 20 points out of the 440 as David Currie won in 50.5 seconds with Michael Davis third and Randolph Anderson fourth. Shane Andres of Pershing won the high hurdles in 15.4 seconds and also won the mile relay.

Jeff Dill won both the 100 and 200 for Northern and Kettering's Calvin Reed threw the shot 57 feet, less than two feet off the league record.
