Relays Hamper Trojans, Hills Finish Fourth

News Staff Writer MIDLAND — Saginaw High's track team has had a tough time getting it going

this season. Saturday's Saginaw Valley League meet at Dow was more of the same for the Trojans. The relay events, something that calls for a great deal of practice and timing,

hampered the Trojans most of the day in their third-place finish in the East. The Trojans finished with 46 as Midland's Chemics successfully defended their East title by amassing 59 points.

Southwestern was second with 55, Bay City

scored 31

Arthur Hill, picking up most of its points in the field events, had 32 points and fourth place in the West Division.

Flint Northern had 35, Midland Dow 28 and Bay City Handy 21.

Reggie Jones, the state's Class A sprint king, did just what he had to in winning the Pontiac Central walked away with the 100 and 220 dashes in the East. He won with West crown by scoring 72 points, while a 10.0 time in the 100 and 21.9 effort in the Flint Northwestern was second with 52. 220. > "Reggie wasn't running for time today," said Saginaw High Track Coach Claude Marsh, "We want him in the best of condition for the state meet so we decided to take it easy and not have him push it. He did just what he had to for the wins, and that's the important thing at this point."

Bob Chapman and Ron McKellar supplied the other Trojan wins. McKellar took the long jump at 20-101/4, and Chapman had the high jump with a 6-1 effort.

Jones also anchored the 880 relay foursome. The Trojans came in first with a 1:30.9 time, but the exchange cost Saginaw opened the race and his handoff to Chapman caused the disqualification. Larry-Foster was the fourth runner.

The Trojans also had to settle for a fourth place finish in the mile relay with a ballooned time of 3:39.5.

One of the Saginaw High runners, Howard Taylor, fell on a curve while running close with one of the Midland runners. Taylor claimed he was pushed while trying to pass, but the judge on the track ruled




