Midland, Saginaw High Dominate Track Listings

Midland High's Chemics show the most depth by a small margin, but Saginaw High's Trojans have the most leaders in The News' second weekly area track listings.

Midland is setting the pace in only one of the 15 events, but is represented in nine to take the leadership in that category.

Saginaw High is listed in eight events, but the Trojans are setting the standards in five events to lead by a wide margin in that competition.

Saginaw High's Reggie Jone's is one of three runners leading in two categories. Jones owns the 100 and 220 marks at 9.6 and 20.8 seconds respectively.

Jones also participated in the Trojans' 880 and 440 relays to take top spots there. Bob Chapman, who leads the high jump competition at 6-6, and Larry Foster are also in both relays.

Midland's only leader is Al Benezette in the mile at 4:31.9.

The other double leaders are Freeland's Dennis Sova in the hurdle events, and Bill Yeo of MacArthur in the long jump and 440

dash.

There are new leaders in six events this week, and the mile got an almost complete overhaul. Four new runners made it intol the top five. The only runner remaining was Paul Singer of Eisenhower, whel dropped from first to third.

Three teams, Saginaw High, Bullock-Creek and Midland are represented in all

three relay events.

The Class A schools lead in 10 of the 15 events. The Class B school: own three marks as do the Class C schools. There is a tie in one hurdle event.

Some of the more outstanding times and distances reported last week came from Saginaw High's 440 relay team of Reggie Carter, Chapman, Foster and Jones at the Mott Relays with a time of 43.2 seconds. Sophomore Henry McClung turned in a 20.8 time in the low hurdles for the Trojans also.

Yeo went 22-3 in the long jump to take first place, Midland Dow's mile relay team | jumped into the lead with a 3:29 4 time from Mark Poli, Paul Miller Dave Hernandez and Randy Kee' and Clare's Don Teall won the Class C portion of the CMU Relays with a pole vault effort of 13-234.
