

Stellar performance highlights meet

Cooley captures Public School League track crown

Randy Williams scored 28 points — more than half of the team's points as Cooley captured the Public School League track championship with a 63-point total in Kettering's 32.

Williams was both hurdler, with clockings of 18.8 seconds

for the 120-yard high and 28.4 for the 180-yard low, and also took the high jump at 8 feet 2.

In addition to each 28-point individual victory, Randy also picked up six points for his third-place finish in the 220 with a time of 22.3 seconds.

Art Little, one of the most consistent long jumpers in the PSL this season, scored Cooley's other individual victory

with a distance of 22 feet, 1/2 inch.

Kelsey Johnson, the state Class A champion from Oshtemo, wound up fourth on 20-7/4. Mackenzie's Andy Smith was runner-up at 21-7/4 and Western's Shelby Lawhorn took third on 20-8.

Cooley also earned six

points on the 800 with a time of 2:12.8 and for two points in the 1,600.

Glen Deardmond's sixth at 47-3/4 for one point.

A wet Wayne State University course and heavy rains late in the program helped prevent the scoring of any meet records. The closest anyone came was in the high jump and the 800.

Williams' 6-3 was only one inch below the league high jump mark, while James Thomas' 1:53.2 time in the 800 for Mackenzie was only two seconds off the record of 1:52.2.

"If it had been a dry day, I'm sure Thomas would have shattered the half-mile record," speculated Mackenzie athletic director Stan Mullin.

Thomas recently finished second in the state Class A, one-mile at East Lansing to Ann Arbor Huron's Don Hubbard, 4:18.9 to 4:21.4.

Jeff Dill of Northern, a member of The Detroit News' All-State squad, was a double

winner in the sprints on times of 18.6 and 22.2. Dill, the younger brother of Michigan State trackman Marshall Dill, was declared the winner in both races by the judge after Cass' Harlan Huckleby was clocked in the same times.

Kettering piled up most of its points by taking the 440 and 800 relays on times of 44.4 seconds and 1:31.7, plus Calvin Reed's individual victory in the shot put with a distance of 52 feet 5.

Northwestern finished third

in the team point race with 30 followed by Ford's 26 and Mackenzie's 24. Chadsey and Perching tied for sixth, each with 20 points, and Northern, a constant state Class A champion in the Marshall Dill era, was eighth with 23.

Northwestern takes playoff

Brothers Daryl and Dennis Royal won two singles sets apiece to claim four of Northwestern's eight points and lead the Colts to the Public School League's Southwest Division tennis title yesterday in a playoff clash with Western and Chadsey. Western finished with six points and Chadsey with four.

Northwestern topped the Southwest Division with a 10-2 record. Western took second with a 9-3 mark and Chadsey, counting losses in Northwestern and Western in yesterday's match, finished with a 7-4 record.
