The flying Falcon's mark of 16:09 paced the 21-school field, just a couple strides ahead of Livonia Bentley's Doug Vorbeck, also a junior, (46:12) and Southfield senior Scott Stone

Jerry Young's squad a run-away victory with 94 points, far ahead of sec-ond place Walled Lake Western's 135 and third place Dearborn's 148. Rounding out the first ten teams

were Trenton, North Farmington, Li-Belleville, Plymouth vonia Bentley, Salem, Westland John Glenn and host Redford Union.

Other individual stars were brothers Greg and Time Thomas of Dearborn who took fourth and sixth, sandwiched around fifth place Mike Redford of Farmington Harrison who posted
