

# Shrine harriers capture 2nd crown

The only thing better than winning a state championship the first time is winning it the second time and that's exactly what Royal Oak Shrine's cross-country team did in impressive fashion Saturday.

Shrine, led by second and fourth-place finishes by Tony Provenzola and Paul McGuire, posted a low score of 85 points to capture its second straight Class B title Saturday at the Charlotte Country Club.

"It's just as good as the first time," said Shrine Coach Lou

Miramonti, whose team also won the Catholic League championship.

Bishop Gallagher, which edged Shrine by a point last week in the Royal Oak Kimball regional, finished second with 112 points with Jackson Lumen Christi third with 159 points and Saginaw Eisenhower fourth with 176 points.

In the team competition, Provenzola was second in 15:23 to Lumen Christi's Pat Fitzgerald who won in 15:09 over the three-mile course. McGuire was fourth in 15:28 with teammates Duane Stewart 16th in

15:59; Tom Walsh 20th in 16:04 and Mike Sullivan 43rd in 16:27.

Bishop Gallagher's Mike Thompson was sixth in 16:42.

In the individual competition for runners whose teams did not qualify, Grosse Ile's Jack Sinclair took first in a fast 14:56 effort.

In Class C, which was also run at Charlotte while Class A and Class D were held at the Grand Blanc Country Club, Muskegon Michigan Christian won with 86 points, followed by Carson City Crystal with 104 points and Mayville with 123 points.

Christian's Juston Wilson won the team event with a 15:44 clocking, with Dearborn Sacred Heart's Charles Fearless taking first in the individual run in the same time.

Flint Northern, using Keith Young's brisk 14:37 first-place performance, captured its second straight championship in Class A.

Northern far out-distanced second-place St. Joseph with its winning 74 point total. St. Joseph had 104 points, with Warren Cousino third with 116 points, Portage Northern fourth with 156, Grosse Pointe North fifth with 166, Jackson sixth with 182 and Dearborn Edsel Ford seventh with 189 points.

Birmingham Brother Rice was eighth with 221 points, with Warren Fitzgerald 13th with 291 points, Wayne Memorial 14th with 319, Redford Union 17th with 344 and Detroit Catholic Central 18th with 399 points.

Steve Elliott of Pontiac Catholic was second behind Young in the team event in 14:47. Dan Sheets of Warren Cousino was seventh in 15:27 with John Grodzicki of Dearborn Edsel Ford eighth in 15:28. Also placing for Edsel Ford was Mike Watson who was 14th in 15:33.

Also placing in the team run in Class A were Dave Lewis of Grosse Pointe North (10th in

15:29) and teammate Jim Fisher (13th in 15:32).

In the individual portion of the Class A run, Highland Park's junior ace Sam James turned in a strong 14:58 effort to place second behind Midland's Jeff Randolph who took top honors in 14:46. Tony Badalamenti of St. Clair Shores Lakeview was fourth in 15:09 with Jim Grabowski of West Bloomfield fifth in 15:12, Tim Cummins of Harper Woods Notre Dame sixth in 15:12.5, Brad Goike of Mt. Clemens L'Anse Creuse ninth in 15:26 and Art Kitz of Garden City East 10th in 15:26.

Kinglsey won the Class D title with 121 points. Ken St. John of Morrice won the overall honors with a 15:44 time.
