1974 Track and Field Committee Heeting

Letters presented for consideration -- Five letters sent to the H.H.S.A.A. for consideration by the committee were read. Suggestions accepted by the Committee were incorporated in the Recommendations to the Representative Council or were placed in the format for the 1974 Heets.

<u>Recommendations</u> -- Jim Long, President of the Hichigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association and Committee Hember Jack Grant, presented HITCA recommendations to the Committee. After considerable discussion it was decided to present the following for Representative Council consideration at its Hay, 1974 meeting.

(1) Consider holding all Final Track Heets at High School facilities in the Lower Peninsula (11-3)

(2) The Committee requests that two mile contestants be permitted to run another event of any distance. The present M.H.S.A.A. HANDBOOK provides that a contestant who participates in a two mile run may be allowed to participate in one other track event of less than 880 yards. It is recommended that item 5 and 6 in the Limitations of Competition be deleted. The same running options would also apply to the 440, 800, or mile participant. (unanimous)

(3) Add the discus on an optional basis to be agreed upon by competing teams or Leagues. (unanimous)

(4) Add the discus to Regional and Final State Heets as soon as possible. (unanimous)

(5) Request the M.H.S.A.A. keep state records as well as State Meet Records. This would include developmenent of criteria, etc. (unanimous)

(6) Eliminate the 180 Yard Low Hurdles and add the 330 Yard Intermediate Hurdles in 1976. Recommend that the Intermediate Hurdles be run as an optional event in place of the Low Hurdles in 1975. (6-5)

(7) Due to Heet postponements, etc., the Committee requests regulations be changed to permit schools to compete in separate meets on successive days with a limitation of three Heets per any five day period and only one Heet per day. (unanimous)

Dear Coach:

For many years the Michigan Interscholastic Track Coaches Association has compiled and distributed an all time high school track and field listing. In recent years, an effort has been made to improve this listing. Such efforts have been hampered by a serious lack of cooperation from the coaches of this State. In 1972, of the eightyseven coaches whose athletes qualified for the listing, only two coaches took the initiative in reporting the necessary information.

In an effort to improve this situation, this form letter will explain what coaches should do to insure the inclusion of their athletes on the listing. If it becomes clear that large numbers of coaches are still unwilling or incapable of cooperating, the listing will either be dropped or drastically reduced in size.

When reporting marks, please include the date the mark was achieved, the name of the meet involved (if it was a dual, tri or quad meet, list opporing schools), and the site of the meet. In track events, list round of competition (prelims, semis or final - the first round is always considered as prelims rather than semis). In addition, note whether or not the time won the heat that it was run in. In the dashes, hurdles and long jump, note wind conditions. If no wind guage was present, simply point out those marks acchieved during a tailwind and describe its force (slight, strong, etc.) If an athletes best mark was wind-aided, list his best non wind-aided mark. Remember that the official time should always be reported as the correct time. Clockings taken by non-officials should only be used if no official time was taken.

Following are the minimum reporting standards. Report your individuals' or relay teams' best marks if they are equal to or better than the first column. If the best mark was acchieved more than once, report all the occasions involved. If the individuals or relay teams have equaled or bettered the marks listed in the second column, report all marks which meet the reporting standard.

MICHIGAN TRACK AND FIELD RULES MICHIGAN CROSS COUNTRY RULES

In the opinion of the writer of this <u>NEWSLETTER</u>, the rules for the two sports mentioned above are very ambiguous, discriminatory and interpreted in many different ways by coaches and administrators.

Any person should be able to read the rules as presented by the written word and conclude the meaning to be the same as that of any other person. It should not be a matter of some coach or administrator giving his idea or opinion as to what the rule intends to say.

Over the years, there have been so many variations of opinion, with bitter arguments and conflicts, with nothing resolved, that it is time for a general over-hauling of these rules for the State of Michigan.

These rules should be written and worded in such a way that every coach would know exactly what it means and it should also be written in such a way that no coach can start to figure angles to get around the rule. If this is possible, it should be done in the very near future without any delay.

As a means of giving this a start, this writer would like to propose the following:

- 1. A <u>track team</u> or a <u>cross country team</u> may compete in a <u>maximum</u> of <u>three</u> meets, during a week of seven days, from Sunday to Saturday, inclusive.
- 2. No team may compete in more than <u>three</u> meets during a period of <u>five</u> <u>consecutive days</u>.

INTERPRETATION: If a team were to have a meet on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, they could not have a meet on Sunday or Monday of the following week.

3. The limitation of competition as set forth by the <u>HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETIC</u> <u>ASSOCIATION</u> and its <u>TRACK AND FIELD</u> <u>RULES COMMITTEE</u> and its <u>CROSS COUN-</u> <u>TRY RULES COMMITTEE</u>, will pertain to competition in <u>one day</u>.

<u>INTERPRETATION</u>: The word "DAY" is substituted for the word "MEET".

4. This limitation of competition shall be restricted to <u>distances run</u> and events entered, irregardless of the name of the event. INTERPRETATION: Today an athleted can not run a 440 leg of a mile relay on a monday and run another leg of 440 yards in a mile relay on Tuesday, because the event is called the mile relay. If the event on Tuesday was called the middle distance relay, if would be perfectly o.k. to run a leg of 440 yards. The question is: What does the name of an event have to do with limitation of competition?

5. If a meet is to be carried over a two day period, the maximum number of events an athlete could compete in would be four and only three of them may be running events. The limitation of competition on either of the two days are independent of each other.

INTERPRETATION: A miler at the Mansfield relays could run in the four mile relay on Friday and then run a mile or 880 on Saturday, (not both) and also a distance of 440 yards or less, provided there are two or more 'events of different distances between them.

POSSIBLY YOU COULD REWRITE OR REARRANGE THE WORDING TO GIVE IT BETTER MEANING. THIS IS ONLY AN ATTEMPT TO GET SOMETHING START-ED. IF YOU CAN SEE SOME LOOP-HOLES OR A POSSIBILITY OF PROBLEMS, PLEASE CONTACT ME.

MICHIGAN RUNNERS WIN NATIONAL TITLE

Coaches Jerry Young of Farmington and Norb Badar of Flint Northern selected a team of seven X.C. runners to compete in the National AAU junior 10,000 meter cross country championships held at Buffalo, New York on Sunday, November 10th. This was the second straight National Championships won by Michigan ruspers. They scored 15 points to easily top second-place Harlem Marathon of Chicago, which had 58.

Keith Young, who was the individual winner in the State Class A cross country meet and who let Flint Northern to the team title, finished second over the $6\frac{1}{4}$ -mile course in 30 minutes, 47 seconds. Pete Kummont of Amherst, Ohio, won in a meet record of 30:34.

Kummont and Young broke the old mark of 30:48.5 set last year by Pat Davey, formerly of Birmingham Brother Rice and now running for the Uni. of Tenn.

Other Michigan finishers were Jack Sinclair of Grosse Ile, third; Jeff Randolph of Midland, sixth; Steve Elliott of Pontiac Cent., seventh, Jeff Zylstra of Grandville, eighth; Pat Fitzgerald of Jackson Lumen Christi, ninth; and Tom Calver of Jackson High, twelfth.
