# Rosary wins

BAD-AXE - Flint area teams Holy Rosary with 67 points for first place and Michigan School for the Deaf with 30 points for third dominated the Class D ' regional track tournament.

HR qualified nine thinclads for 11 events in the state meet while MSD qualified five in five events.

First places went to Ron Hyatt, HR, with a 10.4 seconds 100; George Butts, HR, with 51.2 in the 440; Mark Kelly, HR, with 2:05.5 in the 880; Mark Ecker. HR, with 21.7 in the low hurdles; Scott Kuyawa, HR, with 10:32.4 in the twomile; Pat Weir, MSD, with 48-feet-10 in the shot put; and Wilbert Hare, MSD, with 24.2 in the 220.

HR won two relays, the 880 in 1:35 with Ecker, Jim Stevenson, Butts and Hyatt and the mile relay with Ecker, Kelly, Tony Candy and Butts in 3:37.2.

MSD won the 440 relay with Larry King, Larry Etkie, Hare and Rod Strueck in 45.6.

Other state qualifiers were Jack Martel, HR, sharing third place in the high jump at 5-6; Kelly, HR, third in the 440 at 53.7; Candy, HR, with a third in the mile at 4:49.4; Jeff Histed, HR, second in the high hurdles at 17.9; Hyatt, HR, second with a 24.5 in the 2:20; the MSD 880 relay with King,

Etkie, Hare and Strueck finishing second at 1:35.6; and Etkie, MSD, second in the-100 at 10.9.

Although not qualifying for the state, those help in the final point standings were Butts, HR, fourth in long jump, 19-41/2; Norm Mansour, HR, fifth in the 880 at 2:09.1; Histed, HR, fourth in the 220 at 24.7; King, MSD; fourth in the 100. at 11; and the MSD mile relay team of Kiri Ingram, Tom Shields, Bob Audette and Carl Evans, fourth, 3:49.5.

### NW girls claim regional title

Three state records were bettered, but not set, and another tied in the Class A regional girls track meet at Clio.

The marks are never official unless set in the actual state meet, but give a good indication of what to expect following the regional competition that qualifies individuals for the state action.

Northwestern's 1:51.5 clocking in the medley relay was better than the 1:51.6 state mark held by Lincoln Park. Linnell Jones of NW ran the 220 in 26.4 and the record is held by Cheryl Sowles of Cadillac at 26.6.

Flushing's Kim Flowers was clocked in 11.4 in the 100, better than 11.6 which set the state mark by Carol Stieve of South Haven. Sue Doyle of Clio jumped 5-4, equalling the state mark held by Anita Lee of Detroit Cass Tech.

Northwestern easily won the regional team title with 28 points. The closest rivals were Flushing 21, Fenton 20 and Southwestern 19.
