

Hurons Take Second Place At Ashley

WATERFORD — There is still plenty of time for the Huron High track & field team to make a strong showing at the state level.

Hampered by injuries throughout much of the spring, the Hurons gave indications of being a factor in state-wide competition with their second place finish here Saturday afternoon.

Huron scored 39½ points in the Ashley Relays and accounted for three first places and a new meet record. It was just a half-point behind winning Birmingham Groves.

They have got a busy week ahead of them. They run against Battle Creek Lakeview on Tuesday, meet Lansing Hill on Thursday and then compete in the Southgate Schaefer Relays on Saturday.

John Arndt provided one of the team's highlights by winning the shot put. He not only won the event but set a meet record with his toss of 54-feet-10.

Bill Stein provided them with other individual first place. He took the high jump at 6-feet-1.

The distance medley relay won its race in 11:02.8. The personnel included Reggie Jones, Tony Brayton, Dave Luurtsema and Mark Foster.

The one mile relay of Jones, John Pelkki, Brayton and Foster took a second place with a 3:28.5 clocking.

Huron had two placings in the two-mile run. John Strite was third at 10:14.9 while John Kostishak was fifth at 10:22.8.

Aivars Nollarsdorf was fourth in the pole vault at 11-6.

The middle distance relay was third while Huron's four-mile and sprint medley relays were both fourth.
