EAST LANSING - The Pioneer High track team continued its preparation for the Class A state championships here Saturday with a very impressive performance in the East Lansing Relays.

The four-mile relay teams of Greg Giltrow, Chris Speer, Eric Burke and Chip Hadler broke the state record by 12.2 seconds with a winning time of 17:40.6. The old record was set at these same relays by St. Joseph in 1971.

Giltrow led off with a 4:23.4 leg, Speer had a 4:28.4, Burke ran a 4:24.2 and Hadler anchored at 4:24.9.

The 880-yard relay and mile relay teams were also victorious, while Mike McMahon was an individual winner in the 120-yard high hurdles in :15.0.

Walt Blissit and Doug Hennigar combined for a 1:30.6 in the 880-yard relay which equalled Pioneer's best time of the season. Seven-A rival Battle Creek Central was second in 1:30.7.

Pioneer also ran its best mile relay of the season as Steve Busch, McMahon, Giltrow and Paper combined for a 3:26.8.

Hennigar, who will be called on to carry Pioneer's hopes in the 100 and 220 in the state meet finished second in the 220 Saturday with a time of 10.1 in the 100.

The two mile relay of Pat Brusher, Steve Hartwell, Nathan Huber and Busch ran an 8:12.0 to place second in the two mile while Pioneer grabbed thirds in the shuttle hurdle relay, the long jump relay, and the 440-yard relay.
