## Six records tumble in prep track invitational; Strozier scores double

Six meet records, two victories for Dwayne Strozier, and recordileaps by Jim Stokes and Anthony Brown.

THIS IS the meet where the best in the Flint area are invited and it's too bad a pre-meet rainstorm held down the crowd to approximately 700. If that many showed up despite the threat of further moisture, the crowd easily would have surpassed 1,000 with better cooperation from Mother Nature.

Only two of the records established in 1970 remain after Strozier reduced the 220 record to 21.5 seconds and Grand Blanc's mile relay team was awarded a victory in 3:21.6 after Northwestern's 3:21.4 was wiped out by disqualifica-

The Powers star also won the 100 in 9.8 seconds but his anchor leg on the 440 relay wasn't enough to crack the top five after he inherited a huge deficit.

STOKES, of Kearsley, cleared 15-2 in the pole vault and Brown, of Northern, cleared 6-8% in the high jump for meet records. Stokes won for the second straight year.

Northwestern's Gary Burks won the 440 in a record 49.2 seconds and Beecher's 880 relay team of Vince Adams, Joe Wilkerson, Greg Knox and Homer Mosley lowered the record to

Burks later was to be victimized by the disqualification after a great anchor leg apparently had also added the mile relay record. However, it was ruled that a NW teammate, who was waiting to run the third leg, interfered with another team's baton exchange.

That gave the victory to Grand Blanc's quartet of Jeff Vallaire, Jim Manutes, Brian Groves and Steve

STATE champion Terry Thames of Northwestern and Keith Young repeated victories of last Saturday, Thames at 22-4 in the long jump and Young at 1:55.7 in the 880.

Thames joined Stokes and another Kearsley entry, two-miler Joe Dixon, as repeat champions. Dixon's time was .

Class B entries held their own with the "big men" from Class A. Besides Strozier's two victories, Barry Bailey of Linden won the 120 high hurdles in 14.7 seconds. Curtis Bates and Larry Ashley of Holly and Randy Rife of Linden had second places to further enhance the performances of the Class B crew.
