CHS Tracksters Split In Double-Dual Meet

track teams each split in their double dual meets at Bronson Tuesday evening. The girls' team handed the Bronson girls a 56-47 defeat, while losing to Union City 65-40. The Coldwater boys' team couldn't catch the Vikings, losing 75-48, but held off Union City by a score of 72-51. to pick up their first victory of the season.

Two of the strongest events of Coach Jackie Bilsborrow's CHS girls are the relay races. Both the 880 Relay team and the Mile Relay team were meet winners and set new school records on their way to victories.

The 880 team of Mary Jo Henderson, Jan Linteau, Terri Eberspeaker and Kathy Heator finished in 1:58.7. Later. Denise Dorr, Henderson, Linteau and Judy Kasperski finished the Mile Relay in 4:36.

The only other Lady Cardinal who was a meet winner in an event was Henderson, who tossed the shot 31'2" to place first against both schools.

Several of the CHS girls continued to perform well in their individual events. Linteau outjumped all the Union City girls in the high jump, Heator

the 100 yard dash, and Sue Gray was ahead of all Viking runners in the mile. Also beating all Viking runners in the half-mile was Kasperski, and Dorr did the same in the 440.

Once again the girls' meet was followed by the boys', and this time the boys' performance in the field events was much improved.

The biggest surprise of the day for the Coldwater Coaching staff was the high jumping of Tim Stansell and Ted Pettibone. These two underclassmen finished first and second. respectively, in the meet, Stansell jumping 5'8" for the first time this season.

Union City Coach Larry Kelly had predicted a team victory over Coldwater if his team could have dominated that event.

Larry Wheeler and Rick Watson also dominated the shot put against Union City. These two men threw indentical distances of 39-3 3-4" to share first place honors.

Tony Pope and Tim Stansell were overpowering in the hurdle events, finishing 1-2 in both the highs and lows. In fact,

The Coldwater high school outeran all Union City girls in Pope's time in the highs of :15.55 was just a shade off his school record. Pope also finished second in the meet in the long jump with a respectable 19-2" leap.

However, the Cardinals could not match the speed of the Bronson Vikings in the relays and the sprints and that proved to be the margin of defeat for the locals. It appears Coldwater will have to hustle to hold onto its County Championship, won last spring.
