# 11 records fall in Detroit Central Relays

Meet records were set in 11 of the 18 events in the second annual Detroit Central High Relays over the weekend and the most prominent was Steve Elliott's 4:15.9 mile for Pontiac Cen-

The race was strictly a one-man affair as Tom Calvert of Jackson trailed in 4:32.7.

Both sprint marks were shattered in the deluge of recordbreaking performances under the perfect weather conditions of sunshine and light winds.

William Copeland of Cooley ran the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds and Russ Bailey of Inkster Jid the 220 in 22.0 seconds.

Mike Thompson of Harper Woods Bishop Gallagher posted a meet record of 1:58.0 in the 880.

Records also were scored in both hurdles, Inkster's Ed Poindexter taking the 180-yard lows in 19.5 seconds and Detroit Northern's Ron Davis prevailing in the 120-yard highs in 14.4 seconds.

Warren Cousino took both the four and two-mile relays. The four-mile foursome of Dan Sheets, Jim Fouchia, Tom Loch and Bob Martin was timed in a meet record of 18:20.0 and the unit of Jim Dervin, Larry Hogan, Gary Stanglewicz and Randy Zonca took the two-mile in 8:24.9.

## cass runners 2nd at CMU

Detroit Cass was one of four top teams separated by only a point in Class A at the 35th annual Central Michigan University high school relays over the weekend at Mt. Pleasant.

Flint Southwestern won only one of the 12 events, but placed in six others to take its first CMU team title with 29 points Saturday. Cass, Saginaw and Midland Dow tied for second with 28 points.

Four other metropolitan area teams also were contenders. Grosse Pointe North tied for seventh with 15 points. Ann Arbor Pioneer, the defending champion, wound up 13th with eight, while Windsor (Ontario) Belle River tied fopr 17th with four and Detroit Western was 19th with two. The two-day CMU meet drew approximately 4,000 boy and girl athletes.

CASS HAD ONE INDIVIDUAL winner as Harlan Huckleby took the 100-yard dash in 9.7 seconds. Teammate Tom Seaborn was second in 9.9. Cass placed in five events.

Midland Dow also placed in five events and won the one-mile relay, while Saginaw placed in four and won two events, the 120-yard high hurdles and 440-yard relay.

Henry McClung, the top ranked hurdler in the state in The Detroit News' weekly listing, took the high hurdles in 13.9, only four-tenths of a second off the 13.5 record set by Bill Tipton of Pontiac Central in 1967. This was McClung's best effort for the new season, his previous best was a wind-assisted 14.1.

In Saginaw's 440 relay victory, McClung outgunned Huckleby on the anchor leg. But it was the 880 relay victory that clinched the team title for Flint Southwestern. A relay decision was worth 12 points.

River Rouge, sparked by the Myree brothers, Winston and Craig, won its seventh Class B CMU title with 52 points, but it was the first in 10 years. Rouge won three events — all relays — and placed in three others.

Rouge's foursome of Vernon Harper, Tracy DeWitt, Darwin Dayton and Craig Myree posted a one-mile relay meet record of 3:28.3. Holly trailed in 3:33.5 with Cranbrook third in 3:33.7 and Fenton fifth in 3:35.0.

THE ROUGE UNIT of Harper, Winston Myree, DeWitt and Craig Myree also won the two-mile relay in 8:15.7. William White, Eric Williams, Keith Rivers and Frank Fields won the 880 relay for Rouge in 1:31.7.

Flint Powers trailed Rouge in the point race with 36. Dwayne Strozier of Powers won the 100-yard dash in a Class B meet

De La Salle's Tom Ference tossed the shot put a record 52 feet 1 1-2 and Denby's Ray Bradley high jumped a record 6 feet 2. Cooley set an 880 relay mark of 1:30.1 and Southeastern set a 440 relay mark of 43.8 seconds.

Jackson took the team title with 31 points followed by Cooley's 21 and Ypsilanti's 19. Warren Cousino was fourth with 13. In the girls' competition, Anita Lee of Cass won three events. She high jumped 5 feet 4, long jumped 17 feet 8 1-2 and took the low hurdles in 15.3 seconds.

Teammates Angela Johnson won the 100 in 11.0 seconds and Sheila Gillian took the 440 in a record 59.6. Ruth Barrett of Garden City East ran a record 5:41 in the mile. Josephine Hobbs of Central won the 220 in 25.3 seconds.

Cass won the girls' team title with 30 points, followed by Mt. Clemens with 19 and Jackson with 18½.

#### **Brother Rice Relays**

Birmingham Groves High didn't figure in the record-breaking, but Coach Tom Kearney's team was more than satisfied. Groves successfully defended its title in the 11th annual Birmingham Brother Rice Relays, which had meet records shattered in six of the 13 events.

Groves topped the 18-team field with 31 points. Pontiac. Northern was second with 22, host Brother Rice was third with 21 and St. Clair Shores Lakeview and Ecorse tied for fourth

Although winning only two race: — the four-mile relay and

shuttle hurdle relay — Groves showed its depth by scoring in 11 of the 13 events.

Groves' four-mile relay of Joe Menges, Steve Munger, Ed Strobach and Doug Bonk won in 18:29.8 and its shuttle hurdle team of Jim Lewis, Steve Scheidt, Dan Noakes and Jim Klaserner won in 58.3.

Pontiac Northern, which won three events, shattered two meet records. Northern's long jump relay of Ray Threlkeld, Tom Chapple and Jeff Armster combined for a meet mark of 60 feet 9 3/4 inches. Teammates Mitch Green, Daryl Herring, Mark Love and Tom Williams raced to a 440-yard relay record

Bloomfield Hills Andover shattered a meet record in the distance medley relay with 10:41.1 run by Rick Hall, Jerry Meter, John O'Brien and Wayne Kern, Kern had a mile split of 4:13.9 to pace the record effort.

Brother Rice's two-mile relay of Mark Johnston, Andy Wheeler, Jeff Funk and Jeff Paulsen set a record with 8:06.4 Ecorse shattered the 880 relay record with 1:32.0. Members of the Ecorse relay were Charles Cameron, Calvin Trotter, Kowameh Barnett and Ben Felton. The other meet record was set by University of Detroit High in the mile relay as Tony Everson, Joe Fattore, Kevin Halloran and Jim Baumgartner ran 3:23.4.

Bloomfield Hills Lahser, which won two events, got an excellent performance from John Kretschmer to take the pole vault relay with a total height of 35 feet from Kretschmer, Karl Hasner and Bryon Hershman. Kretschmer's individual jump of 14 feet set a Brother Rice field record.

#### Dearborn Elks Relays

Depth paid dividends for Westland Glenn High's track team as it won the 10th annual Dearborn Elks Relays by only one point over host Dearborn High.

Westland Glenn, which won two events to Dearborn's three tirst-place finishes, topped the 11-team field with 40 points. Dearborn, which has won eight of the 10 meets, had 39.

Detroit Bishop Borgess finished third with 29 points and Walled Lake Western fourth with 23.

Glenn won the long jump relay as Tom Jakubowski, Terry Bixlen and Harry Polovino jumped a total of 59 feet 5 inches. Glenn's 880-yard relay of Bixlen, Polovino, Jakubowski and

Fred Shofmaker won in 1:31.8. Dearborn's shuttle hurdle relay team of Russell Meisner, Charles Cliff, Richard Noland and John Leone raced to a meet record of 57.7. Dearborn won the high jump relay with a total of 17 feet, 3 inches from Lee Capatina, Paul Grzybowski and Frank Celeskey, and it won the two-mile relay in 8:06.5 with

Chris Breest, Greg Thomas, Gary Nix and Celeskey. Walled Lake Western and Inkster Cherry Hill each won two events. Western's Kerry Atwell, Don Moore and Tim Conky combined for a leap of 31 feet to win the pole vault relay and Western's Mark Bradley, Scott Dudley, Lari Korpela and Martin Wisneski won the mile relay in 3:29.4.
