

Ypsilanti Second At Wayne

WAYNE — The Ypsilanti High track team finished a close second to Westland John Glenn in Saturday's Wayne Invitational here.

The Braves took three first places and scored 67 points, only two less than the Rockets. Ypsilanti's outstanding performance came from Jeff Hewitt, who broke a 10-year-old school record with a leadoff toss of 56-9 on the victorious shot put relay.

Hewitt's effort shattered the mark of 56-2 set in 1965 by Dave Harris. Cameron Davis and Marcus Taylor combined to hoist the unit's total to 154-3.

Other Brave winners were the jump relay (Robbie Robinson, Freeman, Dennis Lewis, 16-3) and relay (O.C. Crenshaw, Fred Williams, Calvin Jones, Phil Farrell, 3:27.2).

Also scoring for Ypsilanti were Racine (two-mile, third, 10:22.2), Stark (two-mile, sixth, 10:28.2), and (Mark Jones, Stanley Robinson, White, Jeff Addie, second, 1:31.5), tie hurdle relay (John Coos, Julian Well, Mark Foley, Ron White, 1:02.8), long jump relay (Dave Klier, Roberson, Terry Deane, third, 1 and 440 relay (Mark Jones, Jeff Addie, Klierwasser, third, 44.6).
