## Linnell Jones is brilliant in female Champions' meet

Linnell Jones proved to any skeptics Wednesday that she's clearly the outstanding female track performer in the Flint area this year.

The versatile Northwestern High 'senior shattered three records in the annual Champion of Champions meet at LakeVille.

LINNELL'S performance was easily the best in a superlative meet that saw five other marks broken in addition to three records set in first-time events.

Jones set records in the long jump, high jump and 220-yard dash and also had a hand in the 440 relay mark that also went to Northwestern.

In the long-jump Linnell leaped 18-feet, 4½-inches, 17 inches better than the previous mark. She lowered the 220 standard by 1.4 seconds with a time of 25.5 and raised the high jump mark two mches by clearing 5-3.

NORTHWESTERN'S 440 relay team was 1.9 seconds faster than the former record with a 50.4 clocking. Following Linnell for the Wildcats were Grovette McIntosh, Annette Woodley and Janice Gates.

Using the 6-4-3-2-1 scoring system Jones totaled 1914 points, six more than the meet's only other multiple winner, Jackle Madison of Northern who won the 110 low hurdles and the 440.

Madison set a record in the 440 with a time of 1:00.4. She was timed in 14.9 for the 110 hurdles which is 30 yards longer than the former girls' distance. Jackie also ran a leg on the Vikings' mile relay team which placed second.

Northern and Northwestern dominated the meet with the Vikings winning two other events in addition to Madison's triumphs.

NORTHERN won the 880 relay in a record time of 1:46.9. Its team consisted of Kay Turner, Shella Hopson, Kathy Johnson and Carolyn Brown, Johnson accounted for the Vikings' other victory in the shot put with a toss of 30-8.

Fenton was the only other school to win more than one event and Julie Roberts had a hand in both triumphs. She won the mile with a record time of 5:33.7 and helped in the mile relay, a new event.


Joining Roberts on the Tigers' relay quartet were Sue Ambler. Ruth Von-Seggren and Cindy McQuigg. Their time was 4:16.7.

Michelle Catanzaro won the 880 for. Flushing with a record clocking of 2:25.8. Lake Fenton's Tammy June outlegged Montrose's undefeated Kim Webber to capture the two mile, the other new event, with a time of 12:30.6.

THE OTHER champion was Central's Nora Anderson in the 100 with an 11.8 clocking.

Team scoring was not kept becaused the meet was an invitational for individuals and relay teams. If the 6-4-3-2-1 format had been used for team tabulation Northern would have wonwith 34 points, four more than Northwestern. Montrose, which dominated last year's meet, would have finished third with 24.


