

Michigan wins Tri-State

FORT WAYNE, Ind. (AP) — Dwayne Strozler of Flint Powers High School won the 100 and 220-yard runs and anchored the winning 440-relay team Saturday, leading Michigan past Ohio and Indiana in the second Tri-State Track and Field Championships.

Michigan won the annual meet for the best track athletes of the three states with 183 points. Ohio, which won the inaugural meet last year, was second at 126, while host Indiana was third at 115.

The Michigan team won 10 of 16 events, including all three relays, had three second-place finishes and six thirds. Ohio had four firsts and Indiana had just two.

Strozler, who earned a Star of Stars award for his showing in running events, set a meet record in the 220 with

a clocking of 21.1. That broke the record of 21.6 set last year by Indiana's Willie Knox.

Michigan's winning 440-relay team also set a record of 40.7, breaking the record of 41.8 set last year by Ohio.

Other meet records were set by Keith Young of Michigan in the 880, with a time of 1:53.4; Robert Buckingham of Indiana in the 440, at 48.3; Terry Thames of Michigan in the long jump, with a leap of 23 feet, 9¼ inches; Brad Selden of Michigan in the shot put, 60-5½; and Steve James of Ohio in the discus, 191-9.

James was named Star of Stars in the field events.
