Jr. Olympic big stage for Ithacan

ITHACA — I thaca High
School wrestling marvel Mark
Iacovelli added an important
notch to his career belt here
yesterday as the ninth annual
Amateur Athletic Union national Junior Olympics for 12
to 18-year-olds came to upstate New York, while two of
three Triple Cities-area athletes were bounced out of the
3-day extravaganza.
Iacovelli, IHS junior-to-be
with a 73-1-1 lifetime mark
and a state 105-pound title,
stopped three opponents; including Delaware state champ
Steve Bastinelli in a stunner
at 4:40, to emerge as a contender in the 115 freestyle
class.
Fellow Ithacan Dan Hunt,
at 192, is alive but with an
ominous five "black marks"
(an Olympic scoring device
attaching negative points to
anything but "falls," six
"black marks" meaning elimination), while Endicotter
Mike Koob, at 143, won 16-1
and 15-4 decisions. Owegoan
Tom Haskell, at 132, was
eliminated even though he
won his first match by fall.
Wrestling competition is
tabing place at Ben Light gym
at Ithaca College.
In track and field, which
winds up at Cornell's Schoell
kopf Field here tonight,
Maine-Endwell sprinter Adley
Raboy ran fourth in heat of
the 100 and so did not advance
to the finals. Raboy did 10.33,
well off his personal best and
well off the winning 9, 79 clocking of Chris Richards of Detroit, Mich. The top three in
each of two heats advanced.
Five Junior Olympics meet
swimming records were broken in the start of that competition.
