The MITCA Boys and Girls Rules Committees held a meeting on October 3, 1976. The main item of business was the order of events for this spring. Read carefully, the Limitation of Competition on pages 46 and 47 of the MHSAA Handbook, section 10 (E). You will note that a (5) 2 miler may run one other event, and that all other runners are treated the same (1). This means 3 running events. If you run 440 or more, there must be 2 intervening events. The boys will also have the 330 L.H. instead of the 180 L.H. The Committees generally thought that a new order was needed to make the best use of the limitation. We also realize that not everyone will be happy with a new order, because of individual team personnel. and we have not experienced coaching under

It was recommended by the Representative Council that the 2 mile run be first. The MHSAA Rules Committee will meet on December 6 to make the decision on the order of events. Members of this committee will be in the October Bulletin.

Coaches should keep in mind that many leagues are running the boys and girls meets together, and the two 2 miles make the meet last a long time. Some feel that this is bad for our sport from a spectator standpoint. Others feel that the 2 mile is a good event for later in the meet from a rest standpoint. Please take these into consideration.

We should also realize that the order adopted this year will probably have to be changed next year because these limitation changes are new to all of us, and we will have a better understanding after a year of use.

Please fill out the enclosed postcard and return it to me as soon as possible. Please vote for one choice, even if you have your own. Our Committees will meet again at the MITCA Cross Country Clinic.

Since most tracks are 110 yards on the straight and 110 yards on each curve, it has been suggested that this race start at the beginning of the back straight-away and continue around one curve and finish at the end of the front straigh-away.

The rational for the difference between choices "A" and "C" is that if the boys and girls do not compete together the boys meet would start with the 330 L.H., which would make for a more efficient meet, in that the hurdles can be set up well in advance of the meet. This will save considerable time by not waiting for the hurdles to be set up after the boys 2 mile. The girls meet would start with the 2 mile, followed by the 880 relay.

#### ILLINOIS HIGH SCHOOL ASSOCIATION CHANGES FOR-MAT FOR TRACK (Sunday Chicago Tribune) 11/14

The Illinois High School Association has legislated a series of changes to become effective the spring of 1977. The IHSA Board of Directors, at its meeting Oct. 31 approved the following Changes:

- 1. The 880 yard relay has been eliminated from the order of events, leaving the following relay events to be contested; 440, mile and 2-mile.
- Beginning in 1980, competition in all levels of the State Meet Series will be conducted under the metric system, provided the change is approved for the National Federation rules.

Skip Stolley, head track coach at south suburban Thornridge High School expressed his views on the rules Changes. "Taking out the 880-relay adds more balance to the state meet," he said. "It used to be that four good sprinters could win the state for you by controlling ine 100, 220, 440, 440 relay, 880 relay and maybe the mile relay. Now it'll be less sprint dominated."

"Growing old isn't so bad, especially if you consider the alternative."

Burt, Jr., has really been getting into cross-country running competition this fall, and he had his heart set on creaking the school record at a meet held early in the season. But he came home that evening and quietly reported, "Dad, I didn't make it. In fact, I was disqualified."

I told him encouragingly that there was plenty of competition ahead, and that I was certain he would rewrite the record before the season had run its course.

A couple of cors later, however, I learned that Bud hadn't told me the whole story of his try for the record. His coach, Joe Addington, hailed me on the street and said he thought I should know that my son really had finished first in that race - - he broke the school record by two seconds.

But after the race was over, Bud told the officials that he had inadvertently cut one corner. That shortened the course for him by just a few yards, but those yards might have made the difference in his record-setting attempt. The officials had no choice but to disqualify him.

"Bud was way ahead of the other runners and no one saw him cut that corner," Coach Addington told me. "But honesty was more important to him than winning, and I thought you would want to know."

I thanked the coach, and made it a point to attend the next cross-country meet the following Friday.

Bud took the lead in his race at the halfway point, lengthened the margin as the race neared its end - - and won with a time that cut a full four seconds off the previous school record.

It was a big victory for him, but not the most important one. By then the whole school knew what he had done previously.

He'll get his name in the record book for his latest run, of course, but it was the earlier race - - the one in which he sacri- :ficed his "record time" to maintain his integrity - - that really counted.
