

GP North Nabs CMU Relay Title

MT. PLEASANT — For the third time in six years Grosse Pointe North captured Class A honors in the 36th annual Central Michigan Relays.

Coach Tom Gauerkke saw his Norsemen win three events and roll up 44 points as Grand Rapids Creston finished second with 39 points followed by Flint Central 29, Flint Southwestern 28, Saginaw 26 and Flint Northwestern 26.

A quartet of Bill Weidenbach, Ed Hamer, Dan Beck and Bob Secord turned in an impressive record time of 8:05 in the two-mile relay. Weidenbach was clocked in 1:56.7 for his 800 leg. The Norsemen also won the middle distance relay and got a first from Ken Humes in the high jump.

Don Wollenzin was second in the shot and fourth in discus while Rick Nacey was second in the pole vault.

Cass Tech, which finished with 20 points, set a record of 2:25.7 in the sprint medley relay.

Grand Rapids Northview won the Class B title with 47 points to Flint Beecher's 24. Defending champion River Rouge finished in a tie for third place with Saginaw Buena Vista with 27 points.

Pontiac Cinches Central High Title

Pontiac Central High captured its third major track title of the spring Saturday when the Chiefs set four records while piling up 47 points to win the third annual Central High Relays.

Earlier this season the Chiefs had won both the Huron and Chip Relays, two of the state's major indoor events.

A shuttle hurdle relay team of Nate Haynes, Richard Watkins, Russell Gonzales and Buddy Mason won in the record time of 57.5 seconds. A 440-yard relay quartet of Ervin Walker, Mike Herron,

Paul Bonds and Mason also won in the record time, 43.1 seconds.

Haynes set a record of 21 feet 11 inches in winning the long jump while sophomore Mark Pruente, held out of the two-mile relay on Friday, won the half-mile in the record time of 1:57.5.

Ypsilanti was second with 31 points followed by St. Martin DePorres, a Class D entry, with 28 points and Jackson with 25 1/2 points.

Suprise winner of the day was DePorres sprinter Stan Young who won both the 100 and 220 and was judged the meet's most valuable performer. Following Young to the wire in both events was teammate Brian Haughton.
