Central thinclads third at CMU Relays

MOUNT PLEASANT — Flint Central scored 29 points to finish in third place in the Class A competition of the sixth annual Central Michigan University Relays at Mount Pleasant.

The meet was won by Grosse Pointe North, which scored in seven of 15 events to rack up 44 points and capture its third title in six years. Grand Rapids Christian was second with 38 points

The Indians' finish was the highest of area participants. Defending meet champion Flint Southwestern scored 28 points to take fourth place and Flint Northwestern tied for fifth with Saginaw, both scoring 26.

Central won the mile relay, took a second in the distance medley and registered thirds in the 120 high hurdles and sprint medley relay. The mile quintet of Ted Dobson, Ruben Martin, Bob Badour and Mark Bulmach posted a 3:25.6, only 1.2 seconds off the meet record.

Southwestern won the 880 relay and

place second in the sprint medley and 440 relays. The Colts 880 quintet of Rod Feaster Brad Simpson, Carl Word and James Brewer recorded a 1:29.0 for the victory.

Detroit's Cass Tech won the sprint medley relay in the only record-setting running performance of the meet with a 2:25.7 clocking. Southwestern was second with 2:26.3 and Central was third with a 2:27.7.

Northwestern's points came from a second in the long jump by Gary Nichols (21-5¾), a third in the 440 relay and a fourth and fifth in the 100 yard dash.

Saginaw won the 440 relay with a 42.7 followed by Southwestern with a 43.0 and Northwestern with a 43.3.

Carman's Rob Cummings won the 120 high hurdles with a 14.8 clocking. Central's Joe Hendrick's placed third in 15.2 and Northwestern's Eric Harvey was fifth at 15.7. Carman scored 12 points to finish in 12th place, copping a third in the two-mile relay in addition to Cummings hurdles victory.
