Top Teams' Coaches Sound Cautious Notes

The front runners in the Southeastern Conference girls' track and field race both won Thursday, but their coaches weren't sounding overconfident.

"I expect trouble from everybody," said Brighton Coach Linda Hanniford, after her Bulldogs clobbered South Lyon, 84-30. It was Brighton's sixth SEC win without a loss and ninth in 10 overall.

"It was much closer than the score," said Chelsea's Diane L'Roy after her breed of Bulldogs whipped Dexter, 72-42. It was Chelsea's third

win in four league outings and sixth in seven overall.

In other area action, Clinton bopped Manchester, 97-17, in the Lenawee County Athletic Conference. Pinckney finished second in a quadrangular meet with Hartland, Goodrich and Flint Holy Rosary, and Ypsilanti bowed to Adrian, 77-38, in a South Central Conference clash.

"As far as I'm concerned, the field events will determine the meet," Hanniford said of the SEC get-together at Milan on May 26. "We can all take a certain amount of points in the running events. I just hope people stay fairly even in the field events."

Brighton stayed even with the Lions, now 1-3 both overall and in the SEC, in the field events but took all but one of the races, getting a school record from its 880 relay team. Diane Colbert, who won the discus for South Lyon, also took the 100 to forestall a Bulldog sweep in the track events.

"Everyone ran out of their minds,"

L'Roy said of her team's victory.

"Lots of races were decided by one or two tenths of a second." Dexter also had the satisfaction of setting three school records (Kammy Love in the 110 low hurdles, Laura Kaufman in the mile and Cheri Bennett in the two-mile) even though the Dreadnaughts slipped to 5-2 overall and 2-2 in the SEC.

Sandy Porterfield set a Clinton school record in the 220 and also ran on the winning 440 and 880 relay teams as the Redskins upped their record to 3-3 overall and 3-2 in the LCAC. The Dutch fall to 0-3, both overall and league.

The Pirates scored 67 points at Hartland, compared to 128 for the hosts, 10 for Goodrich and none for Holy Rosary. Cyn Lounsberry set a Pirate mark in the two-mile and Denise Parker won the shot put and discus.

Brenda Wilson took the 100, 220 and long jump and anchored the 440 relay for Ypsilanti, and Jill Day won the 880 and 440, but the Braves had little else to shout about as their record fell to 3-4 overall and 1-3 in the SCC.
