Davison girls win title

Team balance Wednesday carried Davison to an exciting Big Nine Conference girls' track championship at Grand Blanc.

The Cardinals won only one event but scored in every event but one to finish with 48 points.

That was one-half point better than Flushing and ended the Raiders' seven-year hold on the championship.

GRAND BLANC, in the running up to the final three events, finished third with 41½ points followed by Power's Catholic 32, Clio 27, Owosso 23 and Kearsley with five. Beecher did not field a team.

The individual star was Powers' Jeanine Smithson. She was the only performer to capture more than one event, winning the long jump, 100 and 110-yard hurdles.

Eight Big Nine records were broken and Smithson had a hand in one, extending the long jump standard to 16-1%.

Davison's only victory came in the discus where Valeska Simmons earned an automatic record in the first-ever event with a toss of 97-01/2.

BILL PERRY'S Cardinals were second in six events and third in four others. Davison was blanked only in the shot out.

Davison was second in all three relays, Nancy Ducap picked up a pair of runnerup ribbons in the 880 and 440 and Kim Fricalassi was behind Smithson in the hurdles.

There were only three and one-half points separating Davison, Flushing and Grand Blanc heading into the final three events.

The defending champion Raiders closed the gap to one and one-half after the 220. Entering the final event, the 440 relay, Davison had 44 points and Flushing and Grand Blanc shared

second with 411/2.

FLUSHING captured that last relay but Davison nailed down its championship by grabbing second.

"Anything can happen in a relay,"
Perry said. "There's always a chance

Grand Blanc had the most champions, winning five events. Four came in record times.

Claire Smith's 2:24.9 time in the 880 was a record run, Kari Sanborn's 1:01.3 in the 440 was a new standard and little Wanda Stone lowered the two-mile mark to 12:36.9. Smith, Sanborn, Kathy Carter and Sue Adcock won the mile relay in a record 4:15.0.

GRAND BLANC'S other triumph was fashioned by Sue Sincock when she won the high jump at 4-10.

One of Flushing's victories was a meet record, the 880 relay team of Vicki Walden, Sherrie Dorff, Pat Lescelius and Missy Headrick winning in 1:51.7.

Karen Waters took the shot put for the Raiders with a heave of 34-9¾ and Flushing's 440 relay quartet of Walden, Dorff, Lescelius and Headrick was first in 53.2.

Powers' fourth first place came from Brenda Dismond with a 27.5 clocking in the 220 and Clio's Tammy Burch captured the mile in 5:35.7, another meet standard. The summary:
