Cloninger breaks 880 run record

Westwood and Ishpeming boys engaged in a two-way fight that went right down to the wire Saturday afternoon at the Marquette Senior High athletic field before the Patriots nailed down the Upper Peninsul's Class C crown in the final two events. With the mile and 440 yard relays remaining to be run, labpeming held a 40-35 lead, but the Hematites had failed to qualify a team in either event the previous weekend at the Westwood

That left the door wide open for the Patriots. All they needed was a combination of five points in the two racesto take the title.

Coach Gordy Chinn's charges didn't wait long to assure themselves of the championship. With Chuck Cloninger, one of the top 400 and 600 runners in the Upper Peninsula handling the anchor leg, the Patriots won the mile relay in the record time of 3244.

That gave them six points and a total of 42 for first place.

Ishpeming, the 1975 tillist, finished in second place with 40 points to gain the runner-up trophy. Point totals for other teams were Hancock 31, Norway 29, Ontonagon and West Iron 18, Negaunee and Rudyard 16, L'Anse 13, Newberry 11, Houghton 9, Muniting 6 and Stephenson 4.

Westwood's team effort was more than enough to offset an outstanding individual performance by Ishpeming's Mike Dellangelo. The Hematite star won three individual events and anchored the Ishpeming 650 relay team to a victory.

"Iron Mike" was the top individual scorer of the day with 191-points. His first places were in the long jump, 220 and 440 gathses. His time of 30.15 was the fastest ever turned in by an Upper Peninsula athlete for the 440. This performance was matched by his effort as five anchor man in the 850 relay in which he got the baton at least 12 yards behind the leading runner and nipped the Westwood anchor man at the tape to give Ishpeming a win.

All told, Ishpeming had five firsts including the three by Deliangelo. Brett Gauthier was responsible for the fifth with a 13-5's leap in the pole vault.

Westwood picked up three firsts, including the mile relay. Cloninger accounted for one with a new 1:58-42 record in the 830 yard run, while Duane Manter picked up the other with a 6-2 leap in the high jump. 
