Top track meet has many stars; several absent

Record performances by Rob Cummings of Carman and Calvin McQueen of Northern were the top efforts Tuesday night in the Greater Flint Track and Field Invitational that also set a record for nonparticipation.

Many of the best invited contestants failed to show, most notably Southwestern's entire team.

But even without them the seventh annual meet at Houston Stadium was a good one.

It could have been one of the best.

ALTHOUGH MOST of the winning went to the city schools which took nine firsts, contestants from the county area had their innings, too.

Notable were performances by nonseniors, indicating that the track future of the Flint area is encouraging.

Cummings and sophomore Mike Miller of Northern were double winners.

CUMMINGS WON the 120 high hurdles with a wind-aided time of 14.5 seconds but retaliated with a "keeper" of 19.3 seconds in the 180-yard lows. That time erased a half second from a three-year-old record.

Miller won the 100-yard dash in a wind-aided 9.7 and the 220 in 21.7. He also helped Northern's winning 880 relay team to victory in 1:30.6. Charles Hart, Terry Lane and Charles Davis were his partners.

Later, Davis, Hart, James Allen and Dana Daniels took the 440 relay in 43.0.

MCQUEEN WAS as strong as ever as he covered two miles in 9:20.5 while

erasing a five-year-old record of 9:26.

Rich MacInnes gave Northern a sixth victory by winning the 880 in 1:57.7.

Gary Nichols long jumped 22-0½ for the only victory by Northwestern which also was without some of its best talent.

Ted Dobson of Central won the 440 in 50.4 and kicked off the winning mile relay. Reuben Marzin, Bob Badour and Mark Bulmash completed the 3:24.9 time.

THERE WAS NO immediate explanation for Southwestern's failure to show. However, it was unofficially reported that Coach Fred Jackson ordered his men not to run in order to save themselves for the state meet on Saturday. Jackson watched from the stands.

The presence of the 1975 Class A state champion would have helped the meet but the Colts really weren't needed.

Gordon Jackson of Bentley, a junior, cleared 6-7 for the best high jump of the spring in the Flint area.

Hubert Massey of Beecher claimed an automatic record with a discus toss of 144-3½, the area's No. 2 effort of the year.

SOPHOMORE Kevin Wilson of Clio won the pole vault at 13-6.

Stu Selesky of Davison tossed the shot 51-6½.

Kearsley's Jeff Henderson won the mile in 4:27.5.

Sophomores Dave Podsadecki of Kearsley and John Lueb of Holly were second in the mile and 220, respectively.

DAVE DUCHENE, a freshman from Davison was third in the discus. Rob Blackwell, a frosh from Lapeer East, was fifth in the two-mile.

Because of graduation ceremonies, Beecher's excellent Anthony Akins was unable to compete.

All but two second places and all but five thirds went to contestants from outside the city.

Seventeen schools claimed at least one medal for first, second or third.
