## Pottersville collects 2nd 'D' harrier title

POTTERSVILLE — Freshman harrier Martha Kandrak raced to a sixth place finish to lead Pottersville's Vikings to their second straight Class D victory in the Girls State Open Cross Country Championships here Saturday.

In other competition, Ann Arbor Huron captured the Class A title; Livonia Ladywood was the Class B victor; and Decatur earned the Class C crown.

**THE MEET**, which is the unofficial girls state cross country championship, drew over 370 runners from 105 schools. The Michigan High School Athletic Association does not recognize girls cross country as a varsity sport.

The Vikings, a young team composed of freshman and sophomores, compiled a team total 49 points to whip runnerup Burr Oak at 83 points. Kandrak toured the three-mile course in 19:48, 41 seconds behind Class D winner Julie Lantz of Grass Lake.

Other Viking finishers were Annette Hackworth (15th), Michelle Wickwire (23rd), Kathy Roos (24th), and Patti Conarton (32nd). The win was a pleasant surprise for Pottersville coach Tom Swanson, who found himself with almost an entirely new squad from last year's team.

"I WONDERED what they'd become at the beginning of the year," he said. "It's been a pleasant surprise to watch them learn how to run long distances over the year. I knew we were getting better all year and knew we could win if they all ran well."

The Vikings seemed to peak at the right time. All of them ran 30 to 45 seconds faster than their normal times in Saturday's meet.

**IN CLASS A**, Miriam Boyd of Port Huron recorded the best time of the day, a 16:43 clocking, for first place honors. East Lansing's Janine Crawley also earned medal recognition for her 20th place finish.

Cheryl Scheller of South Lyon was first in Class C at 17:38 while Shepherd's Nora Green repeated as Class C winner with a 17:57 clocking. Several area runners performed well in the Class C competition. Ann Pewe of Olivet finished fourth, Beth Evon finished 13th while leading St. Louis to third in the team standings, and Kathy Nichols finished 15th to pace Bath to fourth place.
