Welcome to the 46th Mansfield-Mehock Relays!

If this is your first venture to our annual classic, you are in for a real treat. We think of our track-and-field carnival as the finest early-season high-school meet in The United States.

Balmy weather we may not have, but we do guarantee gritty competition and exhilarating individual efforts. Although the Relays are held in mid-April, the athletes quite often are pushed to their finest performances of the season.

As usual, the best athletes available from a five-state area and Ontario, Can., will be showcased. The Relays have become the proving ground for many eventual state champions.

Mehock Field at Malabar High School is where the action will take place, and the facilities are excellent. A 10-lane, all-weather track is springy and quick, quick, quick! Take a glance at the meet records and you will see what we mean.

In 1976, five meet records were smashed, including a long jump mark that had stood since 1968 and a low hurdles standard that was first put on the books in 1959. The long jump distance of 25 feet, 5 inches traveled by Junior Todd Bell of Middletown was our first flight over 25 feet. Will this be the year of the first seven-foot high jump?

Three 1976 Relays champions were named high school All-Americans last spring. There should be more this time around.

**RELAYS STANDARDS**

For years, the Mansfield-Mehock Relays have been an early season "proving ground" for the scholastic track stars of Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Kentucky, West Virginia, Indiana and Canada.

The ever-increasing entry list prompted consideration of establishing minimum standards to insure peak performances from those athletes qualifying under these standards.

Individuals entered by the coaches must have achieved the standards in their event sometime during his high school tenure to be eligible for participation.

Please be sure your athlete can meet these standards.

## TROPHIES AND MEDALS

All Trophies and Medals are the compliments of Mansfield people interested in the success of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays. Your thanks should be addressed to the donor listed in the program.

A rotating Mansfield-Mehock Relays Trophy will be awarded the team compiling the most points. This is a 36-inch trophy.

A beautiful trophy will be awarded the team making the most points in the field events.

A beautiful trophy will be presented to the team making the most points in the track events. This does not include relays.

Trophies will be awarded the first ten teams in the scoring. These are 20 inch trophies.

A beautiful 20 inch trophy will be given the winner of each relay event.

Gold Plate medals will be given the individual and relay winners.

Silver Plate medals will be given to the individual and relay winners of second place.

Gold Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of third place.

Copper Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fourth place.

Bronze medals will be given to the individuals and relay winners of fifth place.

Sixth Place will receive no awards other than one team point.

## SEATING ARRANGEMENTS For Coaches and Athletes

There is an area in the main bleacher section for coaches with access to the field. (With present facilities this is the best we can do).

Also the pole vault pit, in use for the finals, will be at the end of the field to make for better viewing. Port-A-Pits are installed for the high jump and pole vault.

Scores for events will be announced over the Public Address System.

The Relays committee is privileged to extend to your school a cordial invitation to compete in the 46th renewal of the Mansfield-Mehock Relays which will be staged April 15, 16, 1977. "America's largest independent interscholastic classic" will be staged at Malabar High School's Mehock Field Track.

This booklet contains general information concerning the 1977 Mansfield Relays, results of the 1976 meet, all records, time schedule, awards, special regulations and other data. Entry blanks accompany the booklet.

The Relays committee believes the success of this meet is directly traceable to the fine schools, athletes and coaches who have appeared here each year.

The 1976 renewal drew 251 high schools from six states: Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Indiana, Kentucky, West Virginia and Canada. One hundred and thirty-five of the schools were from outside Ohio. The field numbered 2,274 athletes.

## ELIGIBILITY AND RULES OF COMPETITION

**Sanction** — The Relays are sanctioned by the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations. Teams from out of state may participate if they are not more than 300 air miles from Mansfield one way.

**Entry Fee** — \$1.00 per athlete.

**Deadline for Entries** — April 7, 1977.

**Lodging** — Accommodations for teams coming 150 miles or more will be provided by private families. This includes Free Lodging Friday Night, April 15th and Breakfast Saturday Morning. These accommodations are also provided all four mile relay teams, medley relay teams and 2-mile contestants. Please state definitely the number of athletes who will stay overnight. All we ask is a thank you note to your hosts when you return. **NO HOUSING FOR COACHES.**

**Track** — We have an all weather track composed of asphalt, rubber and sand. The track cost us \$60,000. It has ten, 42-inch lanes all around the track. There are also two vaulting, high jump and long jump areas. The shot put and discus pads have a rough cement surface and long jump pits have white sand.

**ONLY SPIKES NOT EXCEEDING ONE-FOURTH INCH MAY BE WORN ON THE ASPHALT SURFACES.** However, if the athlete desires to wear rubber-soled shoes that is his privilege. The athletes' shoes will be closely checked and if the spikes do not meet the requirements, they will not be able to use them.

**DO NOT BRING STARTING BLOCKS. RELAYS WILL FURNISH THEM.**

**Eligibility** — All boys participating in the meet must be certified eligible by their high school principals.

**Heat Leaders** — Please designate heat leaders in their respective events.

**Classification** — There is no classification.

**Points** — Six places will count and the scoring will be as follows.—10-8-6-4-2-1.

**Lunch** — Lunch will be served in the High School Cafeteria for a nominal sum starting at 10:30 A. M.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS - ATTENTION

**FOLLOW THE SCHEDULE** - Starters in every event must be at the bull pen ready to run ten minutes before the event.

**Preliminaries** - Preliminaries will be conducted in every event EXCEPT the mile run, 440 yd. dash, 2 mile relay, 4 mile relay, 880 yd. relay, Medley relay, 880 yd. run, shuttle relay, mile relay, two mile run which will run in sections against time.

**Relay Exchange** - The 880 yd. relay will be run in lanes and the team will exchange batons in their respective lanes. In the other relays the California Exchange will be used and the teams will be placed in position according to the position of the incoming runners.

**Pole Vault and High Jump** - In the pole vault prelims the bar will be placed at 12 FT., and in the high jump at 5 Ft., 10 IN. Vaulters and Jumpers can warm up at lower heights, but this must be done before the event starts. In order to prevent unnecessary delay in the pole vault, competitors may, at the discretion of the officials in charge, be required to be ready to vault or jump within two minutes after the previous competitor's trial or be penalized by the forfeiture of one trial at that height.

**Rules** - Rules set up by the Ohio High School Athletic Association shall apply to all rulings.

**Out-of-State Schools** must adhere to their regulations where there is a differential between the standards set up by Ohio High School Athletic Association.

**Restrictions - 1977 Boys' Track** - A participant may compete in a maximum of four (4) track and field events. The four events may be any combination of track and field events, including relays, or maybe four track events or four field events. The foregoing regulation applies to one and two day meets without exception.

**Shot Put** - Only puts of over 49 feet will be measured.

**Discus** - Only throws of over 130 feet will be measured.

**Long Jump** - Only jumps over 20 feet will be measured.
