

Kettering's Hogan Sets 440 Record

Even without a season of their own the Detroit Public Schools came up with two startling performances Saturday at Flint's Guy Houston Stadium in the state Class A track and field championships.

Dean Hogan of Detroit Kettering, who spent the season "working on his own" after the PSL failed to sponsor any spring sports, turned in a sensational record effort of 47.1 seconds in winning the 440-yard dash.

A Detroit Redford High mile relay team of Randy Woodson, Melvin Matthew, Abamed Life and Monte Callender set another record of 3:16.4 and this team, too, didn't have the benefit of a season.

Flint Southwestern raced off with its second state title in four years piling up 35 points to 30 for Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills and 29 for Flint Northern. Grosse Pointe North, one of the favorites, finished a disappointing tenth.

Dennis Lewis of Ypsilanti, who three times this season high jumped better than seven feet, won the event at 6-feet-10 inches and Gary Carter of Lakeview High of St. Clair Shores equaled a record of 9:00.4 in the two mile.

Young Keys DePorres to 'D' Title

LANSING — Stanley Young set a 100-yard dash record and St. Martin DePorres came up with winners in five events Saturday to take its sixth consecutive Class D state track championship in competition Saturday at Lansing Waverly High School.

The Eagles, coached by Robert Lynch, compiled 92 points, with Pottersville a distant second with 50½ and Litchfield third with 39.

Young ran a Class D state record 9.5-second 100-yard dash in the preliminaries and came back to win the finals with a 9.6. He followed that up with a 21.6 victory in the 220-yard dash, chased home by teammate Darold Ghoston, the second place finisher in both events.

Young and Ghoston teamed with Mark McClendon and Leonard Thornton to take the 880-yard relay in a meet-record time of 1:29.4 and the team of McClendon, Thornton, Michael Hinton and Michael Taylor captured the mile relay in the time of 3:29 flat.

Weightman Cedric Coles provided DePorres final winner of the day by winning the discus throw with a meet-record 153-foot effort.

David Sykes of Litchfield was the big winner of the day with victories in three events — the 120-yard high hurdles, the 330-yard low hurdles and the long jump.
