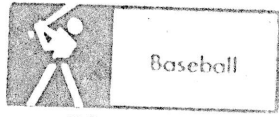

Four Records Set At Huron Relays

YPSILANTI — The biggest indoor track meet of the season for most state and northern Ohio preps was big in number of teams and in records.

More than 90 teams competed in the Huron Relays directed smoothly by long-time track aficionado Kermit Ambrose and his assistants.

A packed crowd at Bowen Fieldhouse saw four records set in the Class A part of the meet held Saturday. Michael Petsch of Redford Union heaved the shot put 61-1/4, more than two feet farther than the old record of 58-8 set seven years ago.

MICHAEL MILLER of Flint North-erna tied the meet record in the 60-yard dash with a time of :06.2. The other holders of the record are also from Flint. Herb Washington of Central and Ralph Smith of Southwestern now share the record with Miller.

The other record came in the preliminaries of the shuttle hurdle relay. Detroit Northern ran the event in :29.8, which broke the old record set by Pontiac Central in 1974.

The local stars were respectable though neither Pioneer, Huron nor Ypsilanti was close in the team race. Flint Kearsley and Detroit Cass Tech

led for first with 35 points. Pioneer high jumper Dave Elliott cleared 6-6 1/2 in the high jump which was good enough for second place. That would have been enough for the meet record, but Chris Koger of Belleville leaped 6-8 to capture first place and the new record.

Andre Williams of Huron captured another second place for the locals. He finished behind Miller in the 60-yard dash in :06.5.

THE RIVER RAT 880-yard relay team of Andre Williams, Scott Mial, Jeff Herndon and Bruce Bright placed fifth in 1:36.9. Cass-Tech won the race in 1:34.7.

Huron Coach Kent Overbey was very satisfied with Williams. "He did very well for not doing much work, except for his job at the Pretzel Bell," said Overbey. "Miller is one of the best sprinters in the country so we are fortunate just to be in there with him."

Don Sleeman, Pioneer's coach, said, "Elliott is more of a team athlete this year. He is always ready to compete."

He also commented that he had a good team with a lot of sophomores with "good attitudes."

Other local placers were Huron's Mike Kilpela in the mile run and Ypsilanti's David Jones in the 60-yard

dash. Both finished seventh.

HURON'S ONE-MILE relay team could have placed high, but the baton was dropped when a River Rat runner was bumped while in the process of making exchange.
