

Dondero girls romp in track

Beth Schlickemeyer, freshman Cheryl Gulli and Nancy Liponoga each won two events yesterday to power the Royal Oak Dondero High girls' track team past Southfield-Lathrup, 96-40.

Schlickemeyer set a Dondero school record with a time of 1 minute, 0.9 seconds in the 440, and Liponoga set another school record with a toss of 32 feet, 2 inches in the shot put.

Detroit Dominican ran its track record to 3-0 with a 75-58 Catholic League victory over Birmingham Marian. Double winners Jackie Burton and Debbie Lager led Dominican. Burton won the shot put with a toss of 36 feet and also took the discus with a throw of 102-11 inches. Lager won the two-

mile run in 13:10 seconds and the mile in 6:27.

Julie Jackson took the 880 and the mile to pace Detroit Central's 73-28 rout of Chadsey in the Public School League. Chadsey's Elaine Jones won the 100-yard dash in 11.5 seconds and took the 220 in 25.5.

Auburn Heights Anvondale, with Sandy Rohe coming from way back to win on the anchor leg of the mile relay, nipped Lake Orion, 70-66, in the Oakland-A League. Rohe also won the 440 and teammate Theresa Manning won the discus and the long jump. Orion's Pam Fox won the mile and two-mile.

Freshman Sherri Moss set school records with times of 13:22.4 and 6:13.8, respectively, in the two-

mile and mile runs, and ninth-grade teammate Laura Schultz set another school mark with a 1:08.5 showing in the 440 in Woodhaven's 86-50 triumph over Gibraltar Carlson.

Rochester Adams, sparked by Pat Raymond's victories in the shot put and discus, defeated Troy Athens, 77½-58½. Athens' Roxanne Ostrawski set a school mark with a 73-8½ throw in the discus.

Felicia Brown's long jump and high jump victories helped Mumford defeat Mackenzie, 75-54. Mackenzie's Delisa Walton won the 440 and 880.

Cody, with Lisa Glenn taking the 100 in 11.8 and the 220 in 25.7, upended Cooley, 67½-56½.

Boys' track

Detroit Central won the mile relay in 3:33.6 to overtake Chadsey, 70½-65½, in the Public School League.

Central's Robert Johnson took the 440 in 52.2 and the 220 in 23.3, and teammate Daryl James won the 100 in 10.1. Chadsey had a pair of double winners. William Humphries won the shot put and the discus, and Mark Morse claimed the mile and two-mile runs.

In the Oakland-A League, Steve LaBelle took victories in the 220 and the high jump and Jeff Soulliere won the long jump and 440 as Romeo overpowered Clawson, 136-22.

Mark Resendez won three events — low hurdles (41.5), 440 (52.0) and 220 (23.1) — and finished second in the high jump to pace Lake Orion over Avondale, 88-70. Orion's Bob Gibson took the high hurdles (15.6) and pole vault (13-0) and anchored the winning 440 relay.

Led by Terry Ross, who won the 880 in 2:00.4 and anchored his team's winning

mile relay time of 3:32.5, Dearborn Heights Robichaud hung a 92-63 Suburban Athletic Conference setback on Ecorse.

Brothers Steve and Matt Krogulecki each won two events to spark Redford Bishop Borgess' 93-65 victory over Livonia Churchill. Steve took the 100 in 10.2 and the 220 in 23.1, and Matt swept the hurdles. Borgess' Chuck Cole won the 880 and the mile run.

Keith Kline won both hurdles to help Livonia Franklin raise its record to 3-0 with a 98-60 Northwest Suburban League victory over Westland John Glenn.

Osborn used four double winners to rip Denby, 97½-56½. Dave Shaina, Byron Holmes, Robert Banks and Carlos Jackson won two events each for Osborn, which upped its record to 2-0.

Skip Ballish, Chris Ray and Mike Lasley each won two events as unbeaten Royal Oak Dondero (4-0) clobbered Southfield-Lathrup, 109½-48½. Ballish took the discus (144-7) and shot put (46-10); Ray won the 100

(10.5) and 220 (23.9); and Lasley won the mile (4:40.6) and two mile (16:07.7).

Russell Parks and Andy Lytle each won two events to lead Birmingham Groves to a 91-66 victory over Bloomfield Hills Lahser. Groves is unbeaten in 31 straight dual meets.
