

Mott trackmen triumph in ti

Rick Auston was spectacular yesterday, but that did not save his Walled Lake Central track team from finishing last in a boys' high school triangular meet. Waterford Mott won the meet with 77 points, Southfield was second with 52 and Walled Lake Central third with 35.

Auston won 330-yard low hurdles in 41.7 seconds, the 100 dash in 10.3 and the 220 dash in 23.7.

Joe Meehan set a Roseville Brablec Field record in the pole vault with a leap of 13 feet, 9 inches to help Grosse Pointe North to a 127-31 victory over Brablec. Dave Hudgens won the 120-yard high hurdles and 330-yard low hurdles to pace Utica Ford to a 112-46 victory over Clawson. Romeo, led by Steve LaBelle's victories in the high jump and long jump, whipped Utica, 121-37. Rick Kent and Paul Harper each won two events to spark Harper Woods Notre Dame over Lutheran

East, 108-52. Courtney Vance and Eddie Guindi each won two events to lead Detroit Country Day to an 81-77 triumph over Bloomfield Hills Cranbrook. Dave McKenzie won the discus, shot put and high hurdles to power East Detroit over Mt. Clemens L'Anse Creuse North, 113-455. Ecorse, led by double winner Reggie Oliver, edged Willow Run, 85-72.

Dave Schrader won the mile in 4:39.9 and two miles in 9:49 to highlight West Bloomfield's 95-62½ victory over Waterford Kettering. Chuck Aldrich of Kettering won the high hurdles in 15.3 and low hurdles in 42.1. Birmingham Groves, led by Andy Lytle's victories in the discus (157 feet) and shot put (44-7), beat Pontiac Northern, 86-69.

Jim Davis and Dale Hart each won two events to help Detroit Henry Ford defeat Cooley, 83-63. Davis won the 100 dash in 9.9 and the 220 in 22.5. Osborn had three double winners — Fred Wilson, Terry Hannah and Russell Steppes — to defeat Finney, 98-23. Mumford, led by double winners Tim Kenney and Jody Cleveland, beat Cody, 87-60. Maurice Tutton won the 880 in 2:05 and mile run in 4:44, and Wallace Jones took both hurdle events as Detroit Central rolled past Southwestern, 91-15.

Lisa Littleton raced to winning times of 11.6 seconds in the 100 dash and 25.4 seconds in the 220, and Julie Jackson also won two events to spark the Detroit Central girls' track team past Southwestern, 72-28. Daphne Mitchell took the hurdles and ran on the winning mile relay to highlight Detroit Ford's 70-64 victory over Cooley. Mumford, helped by Kim Turner's victory in the hurdles in 14.9 seconds, beat Cody, 64½-57½. Annette Sassin won the two miles to give Denby a 69-67 victory over Pershing.

Debbie Peters won the high jump with a leap of 5-2 and the 110-yard low hurdles in 15.1 seconds as unbeaten Royal Oak Kimball won a triangular meet. Kimball (5-0) had 71 points, Warren Woods 42½ and Warren Mott 32½. Adele Anderson won the shot put with a throw of 24-8½ and discus with an effort of 78-2 to pace Troy Athens' 86-50 victory over Oak Park.

Monique Ozimkowski won the long jump and hurdles and also ran on the winning 440 and 880 relays to power West Bloomfield over Waterford Kettering, 105-31. Teammate Cindy Poly took the mile and two miles. Betty Berry won the 440

and 880 to lead Pontiac Northern past Birmingham Groves, 87½-47½. Groves' Lisa Shasky won the shot put and discus.
