# Cass Tech grabs PSL track crown

Marcus Allen's double record-breaking finishes in the high and low hurdles Thursday led Cass Tech to the team title in the 77th Public School League track and field championships at Martin Luther King High.

Allen broke William Howard's mark of 14.4 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles by three-tenths of a second, finishing at 14.1. He then went on to shatter the 330-yard low hurdles record with a finish of 37.0.

Cass finished the evening with 87 points, topping second-place Redford's 60 points. Chadsey placed third with 58 points, followed by Mumford 57, Central 53 and Kettering with 30.

**CHADSEY'S** William Humphries broke the PSL record in the discus with a 151-foot 1½-inch throw. He also won the shotput event.

Deon Hogan of Kettering was a double-winner in the boy's division. He broke Jim Grace's record of 47.4 in the 440-yard dash with a 47.0 run, and also won the 220-yard dash.

A minute of silence was held at the championships in memory of Central High discus qualifier Dave Leonard, who was killed Wednesday night while working in a neighborhood grocery store.

**IN THE GIRLS' division,** Cass also won the team title with 73 points. Mumford finished second with 49 points. Kettering was third with 47, followed by Mackenzie, 44; Cody, 34; Chadsey, 29.

A slew of records were broken with Cass' Davida Booser and Mackenzie's Delisa Walton leading the pack. Booser broke records in the discus and shotput, throwing 111-1½ and 39-6½, respectively.

Walton had record-breaking finishes in the 880-yard run with a 2:11.2, and in the 440-yard dash with a 54.1.

Chadsey's Elaine Jones was a double-winner, breaking a record in the 100-yard dash, with a 10.72, and finishing first in the 220-yard dash.

Other females shattering records were: Kim Turner of Mumford in the 110-yard low hurdles, with a 14.35; Kettering in the 880-yard relay with a 1:43.4; Kim Clark of Pershing in the two-mile run, with a 12:57.5; Mackenzie in the mile relay, with a 3:54.4.

"This was not easy," said Montreal defenseman Larry Robinson. "I'm really tired," added Robinson, who was voted the outstanding player in the National Hockey League playoffs.

"I believe this team is better or at least as good as our championship teams the last

Robinson, who assisted on Montreal's first two goals, was named winner of the Conn Smythe Trophy as the most valuable player in the playoffs.

In 15 games, Robinson scored four goals and had 17 assists. He tied teammate Guy Lafleur with 21 points for scoring honors in post-season play.
