Cass Tech's teams sweep new PSL-Catholic track meet

Cass ran off with both titles in a meet which was completed despite a downpour midway through the festivities. points to runnerup Mackenzie's 46 with Immaculata leading the Catholic League entries with 42 points.

The PSL won the meet despite the absence of Deon Hogan, the flashy Kettering sprinter, who decided to pass up the meet to prepare for Saturday's more important state championships.

But Marcus Allen of Cass Tech, the league's premier hurdler, was there. Allen won both the 330-yard low hurdles and 120-yard highs as Cass won six firsts despite the sloppy going.

One of the meet's brightest stars was Mackenzie's Delisa Walton who turned in a double winning both the 440- and 880-yard runs.

Although Grosse Pointe North wasn't competing in this meet, the Norsemen of coach Tom Gauerke concluded another great season defeating Grosse Pointe South, 116%-301%, to rack up its 85th straight dual meet victory. North, too, is one of the favorites in Saturday's state championships.
