

Cass Tech races past the Catholic League

Cass Tech swept both the Public School League boys' and girls' track championships last Friday, and yesterday, on the same Martin Luther King High School course, they did it again against the Catholic League's boys' and girls' teams.

The Cass boys' team rolled up 84 points while two PSL rivals, Central with 43 and Mumford with 37, were second and third. Redford Township Bishop Borgess, the newly crowned Catholic League champion, was fourth with 36 points, Redford fifth with 30 and De Porres sixth with 28.

In the girls' competition, Cass totaled 62 points to PSL foe Mackenzie's 46. Detroit Immaculata was third with 42, Farming-

ton Our Lady of Mercy next with 33, Mumford fifth with 30 and Southgate Aquinas sixth with 22.

Marcus Allen of Cass and two Chadsey rivals, William Humphries and Mark Morse, were double winners. Allen, the son of PSL Assistant Director Roy Allen, took the 120-yard high hurdles and 330-yard low hurdles with clockings of 14.2 and 38.3 seconds.

Humphries tossed the shot put 57 feet, 6½ inches and the discus 146 feet, while Morse won the one and two-mile races with times of 4:27.3 and 9:42.2.

Robert Johnson of Central took the 100-yard dash in 9.8 seconds, Fedell Cason of

Cass the 220 in 22.5 seconds, Lyle Ahamed of Redford the 440 in 49.5 seconds and Mike Shea of De La Salle the 880 in 1:58.9.

Jeff Sarnacki of Riverview Gabriel Richard pole vaulted 12 feet, 6 inches, Reggie Ashley of Cass long jumped 21 feet, 5 inches and Jon English of Birmingham Brother Rice high jumped 6 feet, 5 inches.

In the relays, Redford won the one-mile in 3:24.3 and Cass won the 440 and 880 in 43.6 seconds and 1:30.7.

Delisa Walton of Mackenzie was the only double winner in the girls' competition. She won the 440 in 56.1 seconds and the 880 in 2:11.4. Elaine Jones of Chadsey

won the 100 in 10.7 seconds and Carmea Rivers of Mackenzie the 220 in 24.8.

Catholic League entries won both the one and two-mile events. Lori Bennett of Livonia Ladywood took the mile with a 5:18.8 and Sue Heinlen of Farmington Our Lady of Mercy the two-mile in 11:57.5. Kim Turner of Mumford won the 110-yard low hurdles in 14.2 seconds.

In field events, Beth Bosse of Our Lady of Mercy tossed the discus 112 feet, 9½ inches, Davida Boozer of Cass the shot put 36 feet, 7 inches, Rhonda Beauford of Mumford high jumped 5 feet, 8 inches and teammate Felecia Brown long jumped 17 feet, 8¼ inches.
